Career Connected Learning

Tips to Get Started

- Kids start to form ideas about what they want to do for work when they are very young.
- A career is the life you want to lead not just a job, occupation, or profession.
- Career Connected Learning helps youth feel better prepared to follow their interests to potential career pathways.
- Learners need support to prepare for a rapidly changing world of work.

DISCUSS INTERESTS RELATED TO CAREERS.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

These discussions improve well-being, mental health and satisfaction in life.

IDEAS FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS

- Encourage youth to ask questions and be curious about their futures
- Make talking about future plans part of family activities.
- Help your youth discover their passions.
- · Focus on things they are interested in.
- Support them when discussing career opportunities.
- Look for opportunities for your youth to discover and develop their skills.



DISCUSS HOW PERSONAL NEEDS RELATE TO YOUR YOUTH'S INTERESTS.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

This increases youth engagement and motivation to pursue interests and develop related skills.

IDEAS FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS

- Ask students what they are interested in learning about most (at school, at home, and in their community).
- Work together through the decision-making process about family decisions.
- Support your youth in making decisions related to first jobs like babysitting, yard care, etc.

CONNECT WITH COMMUNITY MEMBERS

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

This helps build understanding of potential future goals and career pathways.

IDEAS FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS

- Talk about interests and ask questions about potential career paths

DISCUSS ACTIONS TO MAKE THE WORLD A BETTER PLACE.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

This can help youth work towards future careers for a sustainable planet.

IDEAS FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS

- Discuss areas of interest and related skills, knowledge, and/or occupations in relation to making a positive contribution to their community and the world.
- Talk about global issues that are in the news and what youth are doing to take action.

TALK ABOUT THE POTENTIAL OF FUTURE CAREERS.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

This lessens fear of and anxiety about the future.

IDEAS FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS

- Model skills needed to manage learning, work and, transitions.
- Avoid discussing the future as scary with little hope for success.
- Discuss how people are creating sustainable careers.
