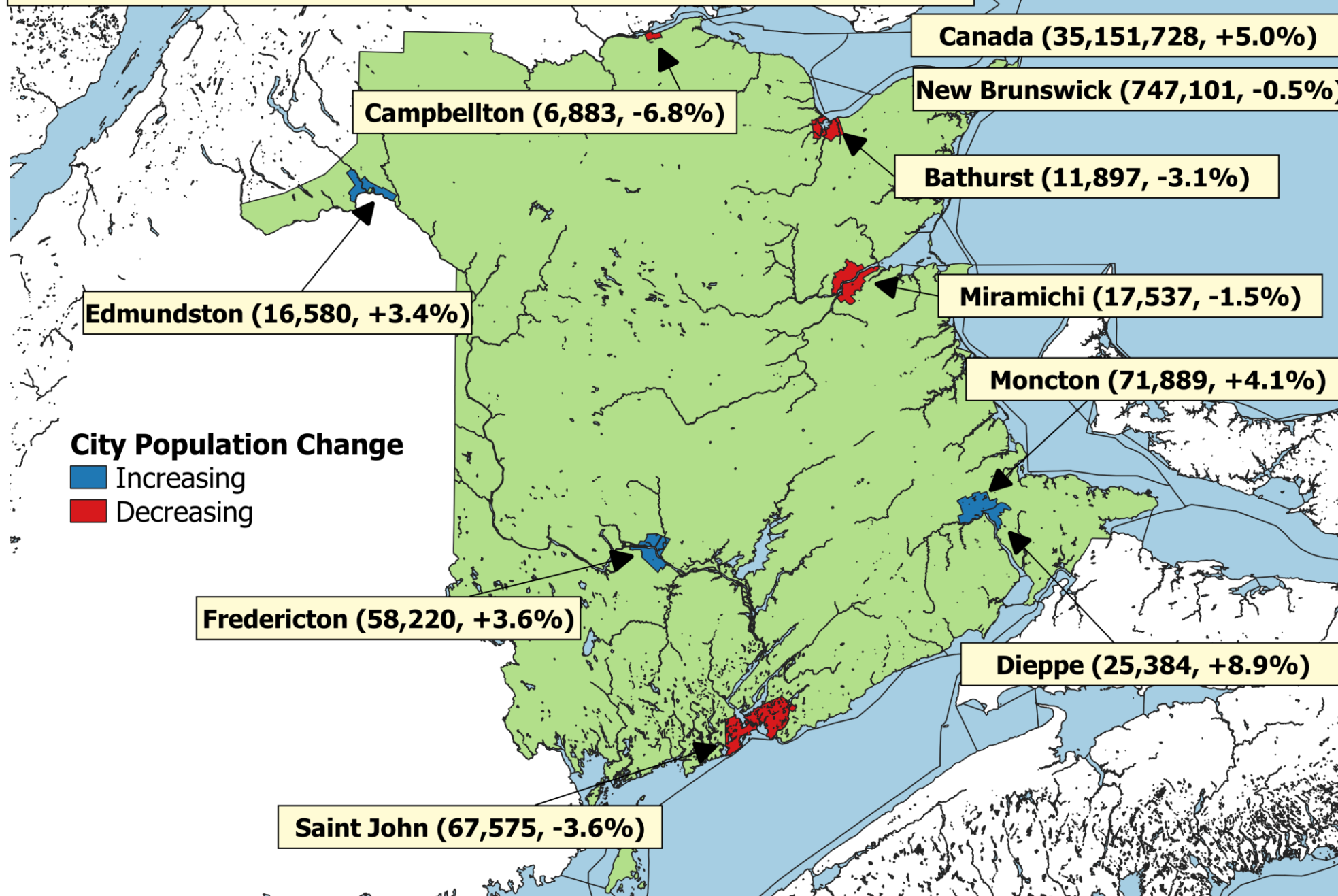

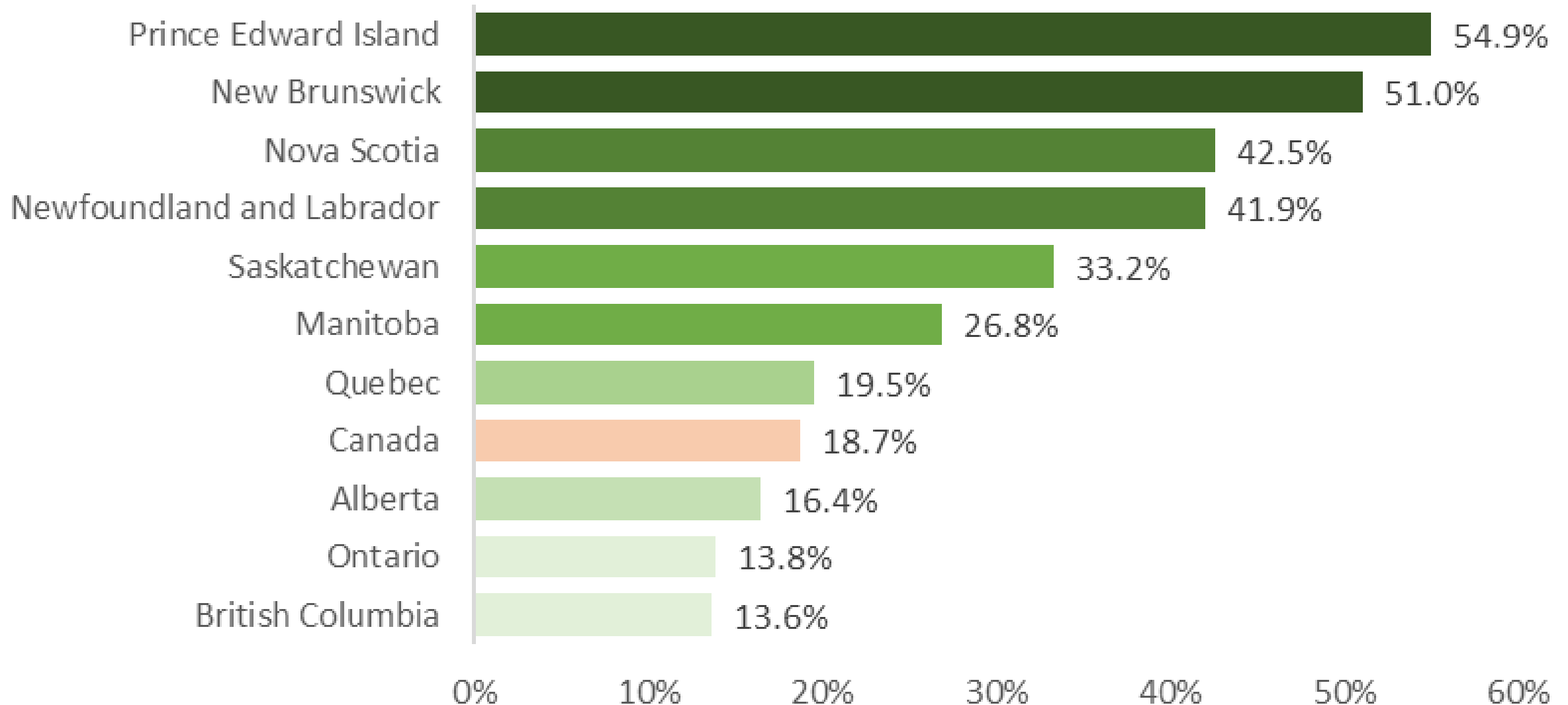

Percentage of Rural Population by Province, 2016 (%)

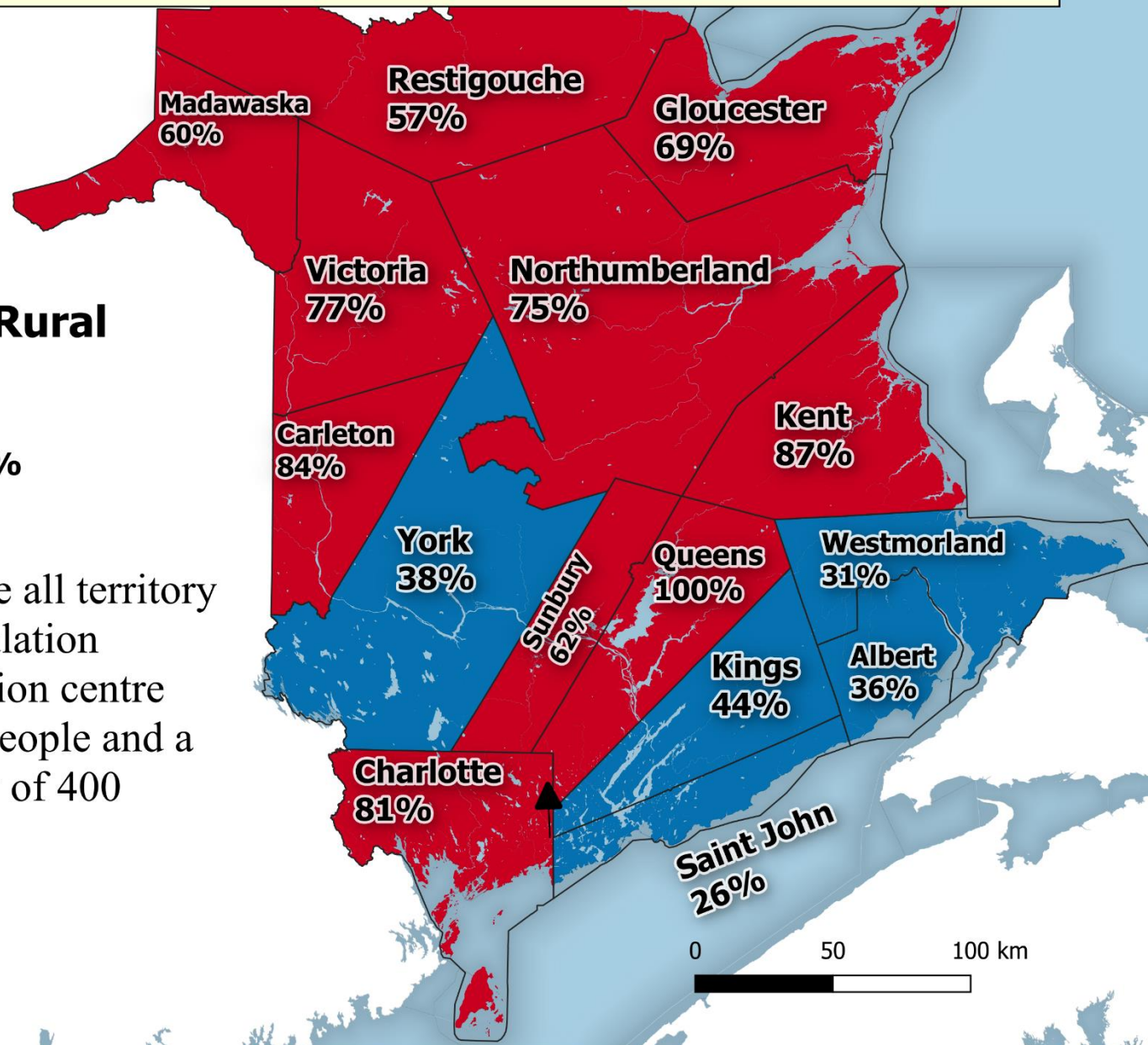


Proportion of Rural Population in New Brunswick by County, 2016

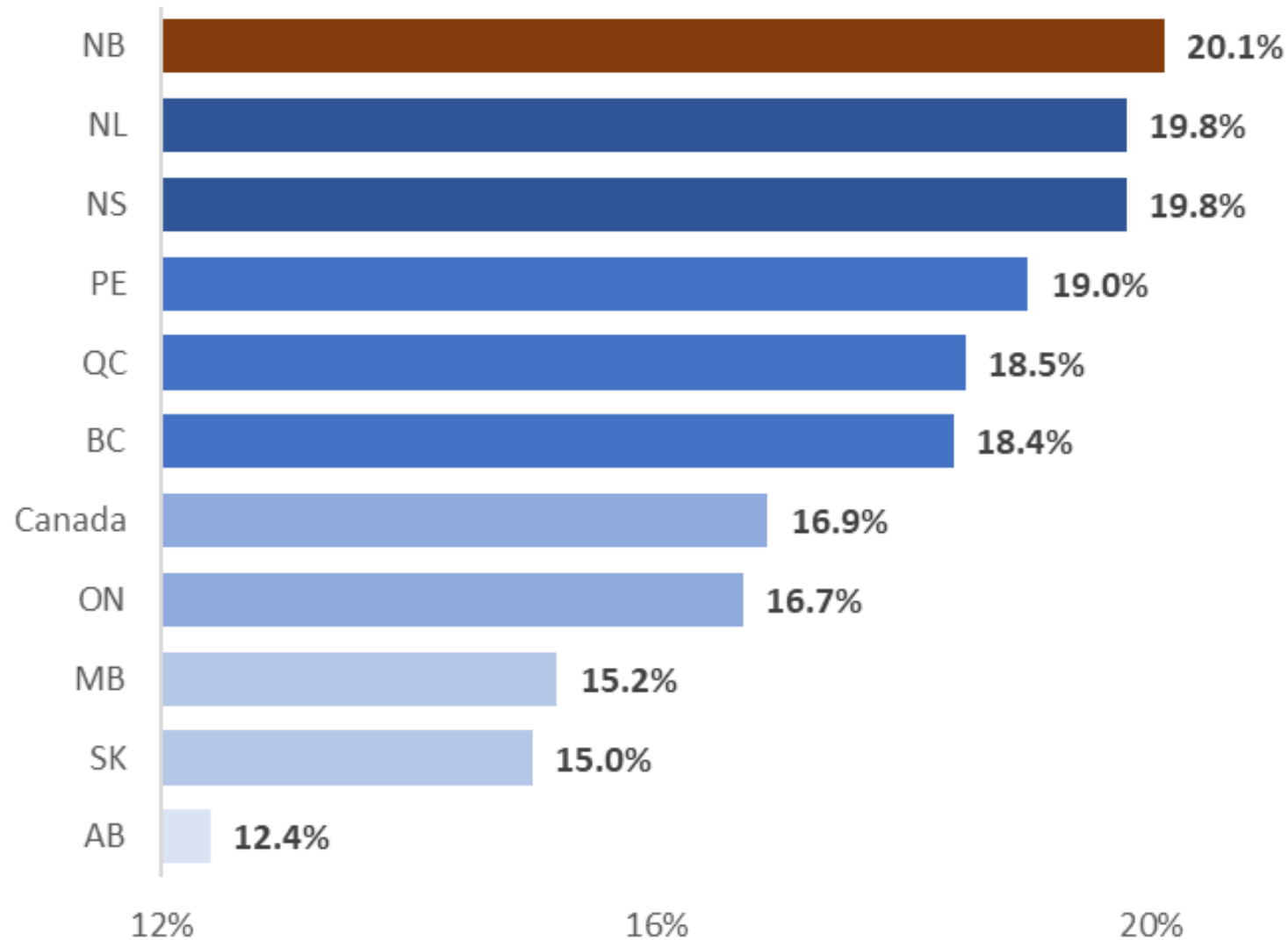

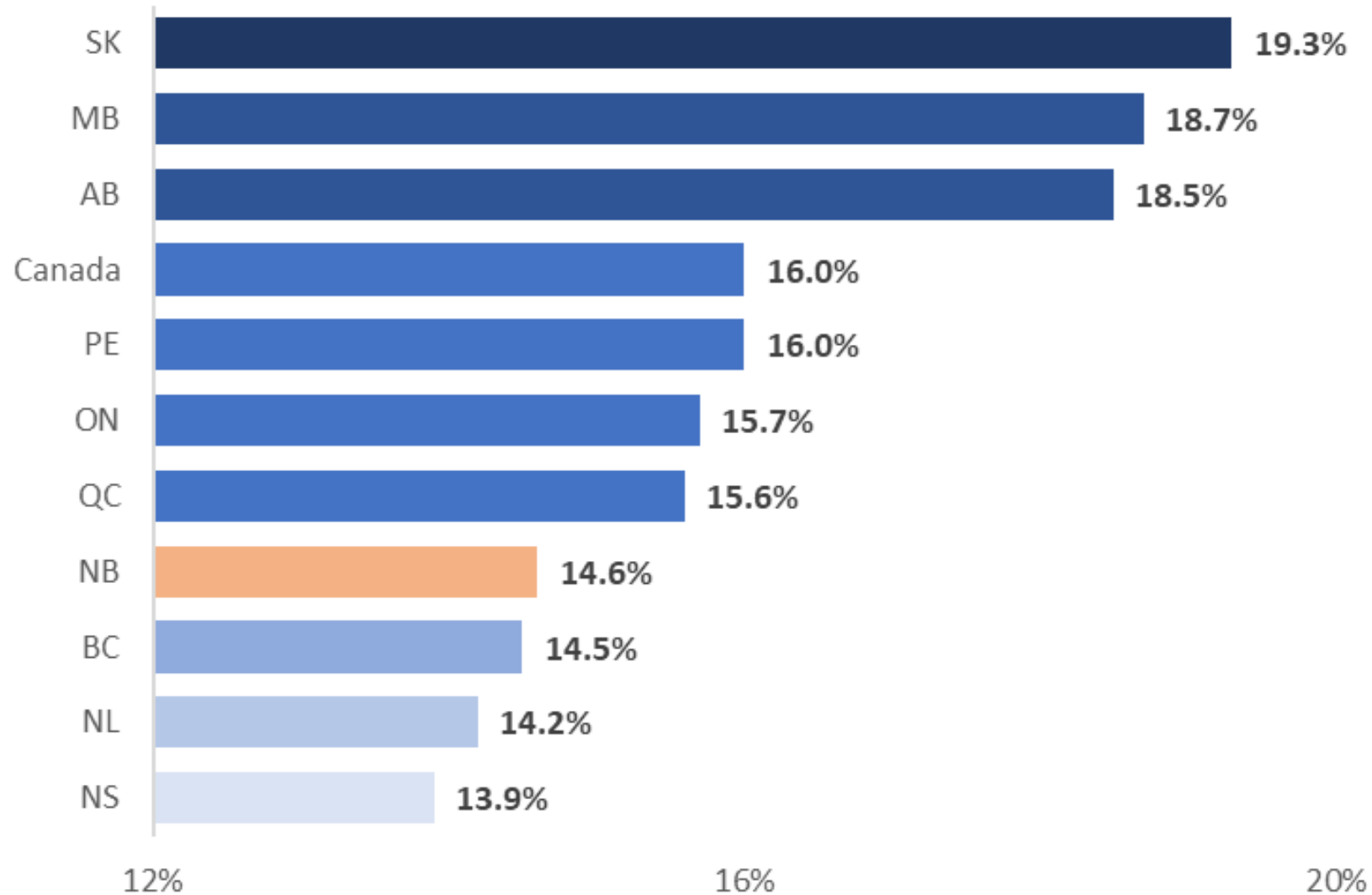
Rural areas include all territory lying outside population centres. A population centre has at least 1000 people and a population density of 400 persons per km².



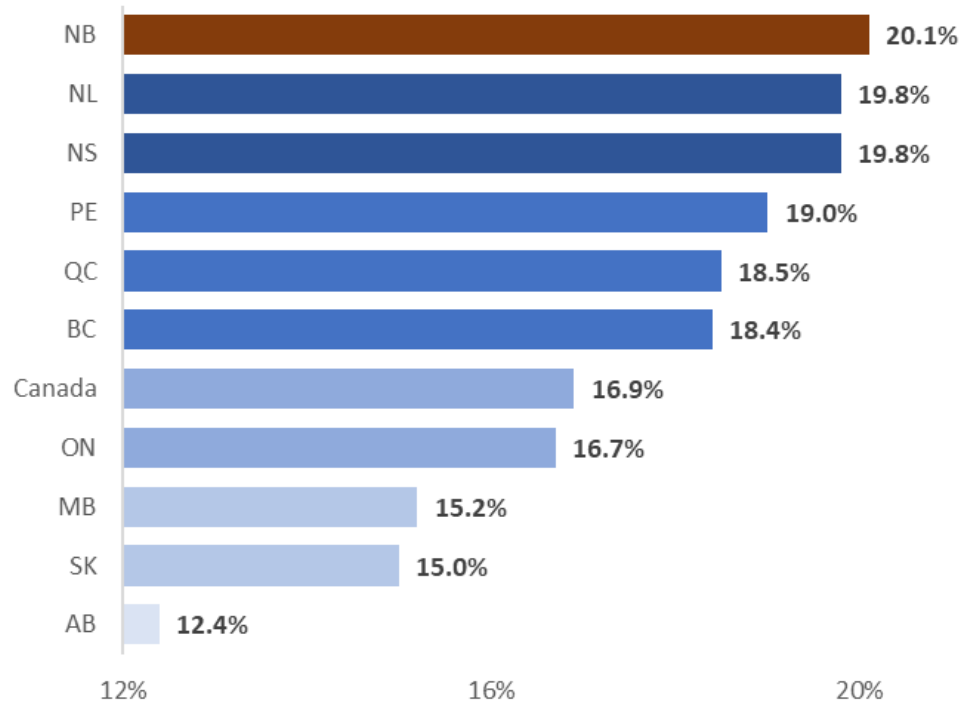
Percentage of the Population Aged 65 Years and Older



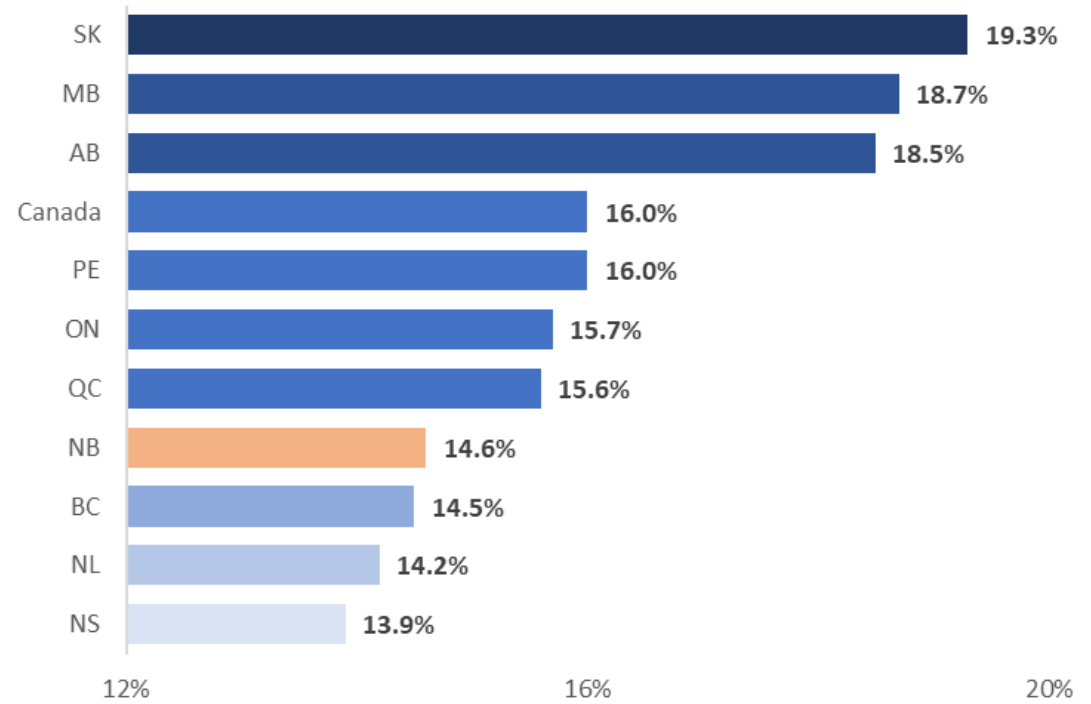
Percentage of the Population Aged 0 to 14 Years



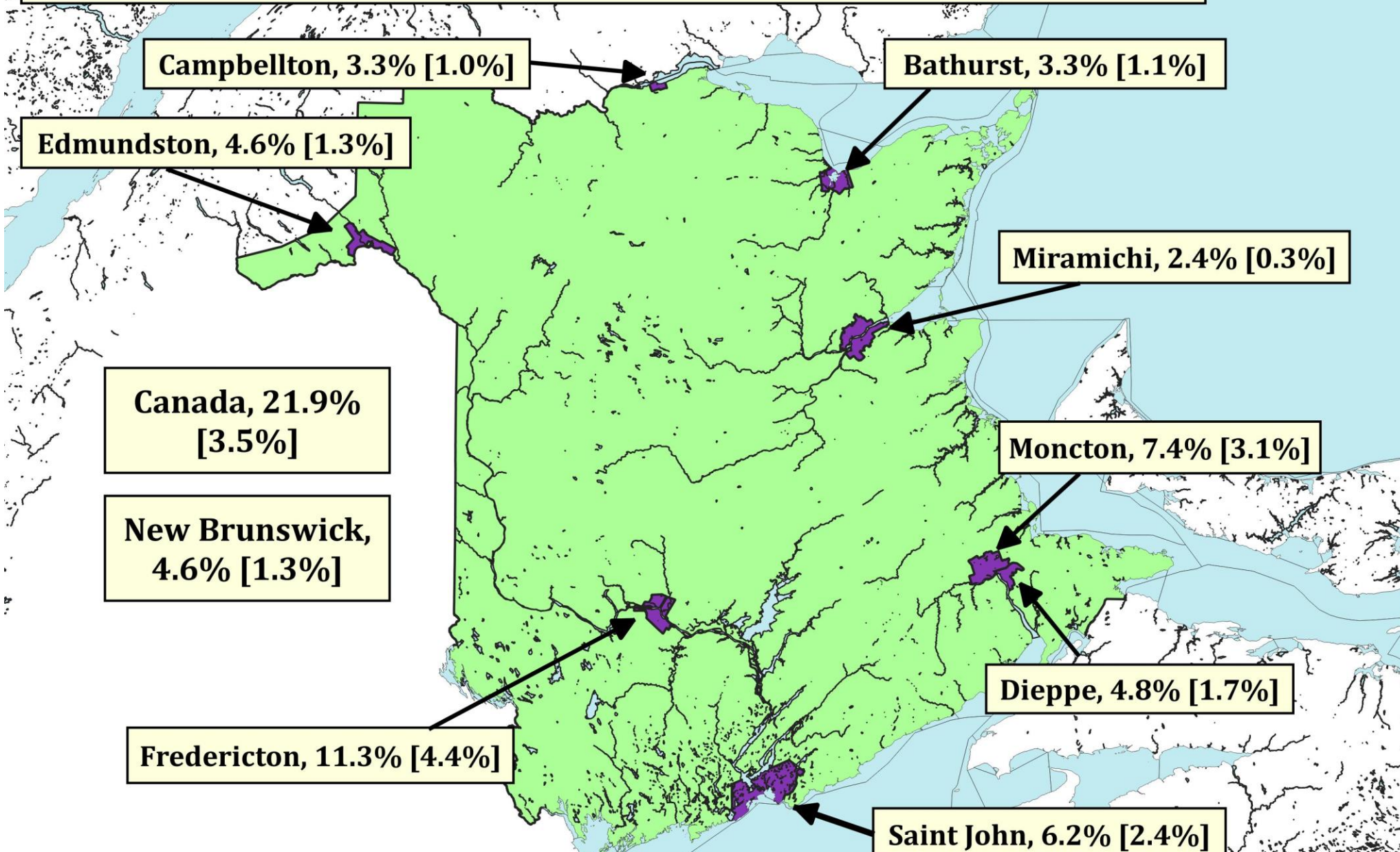
Percentage of the Population Aged 65 Years and Older



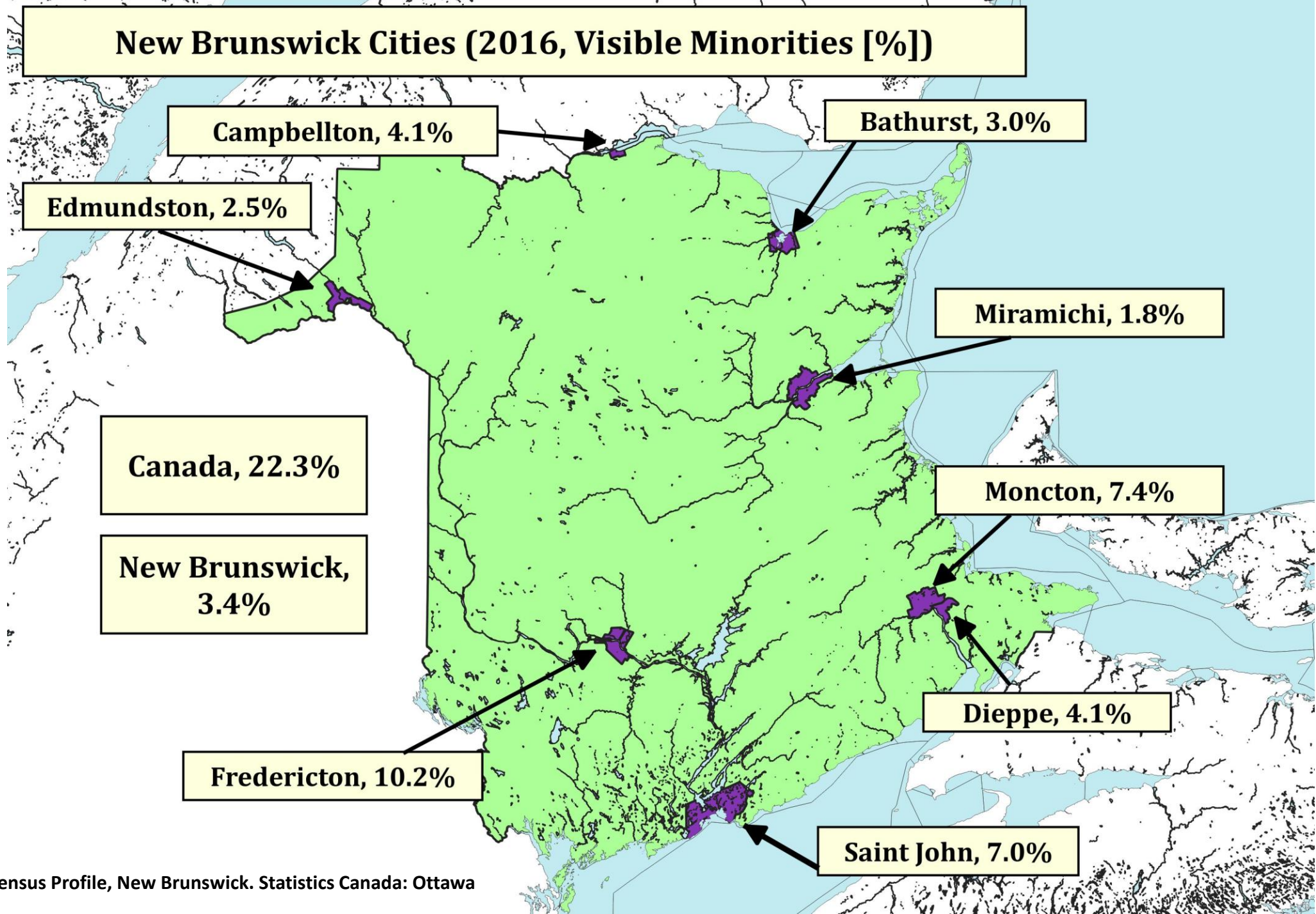
Percentage of the Population Aged 0 to 14 Years



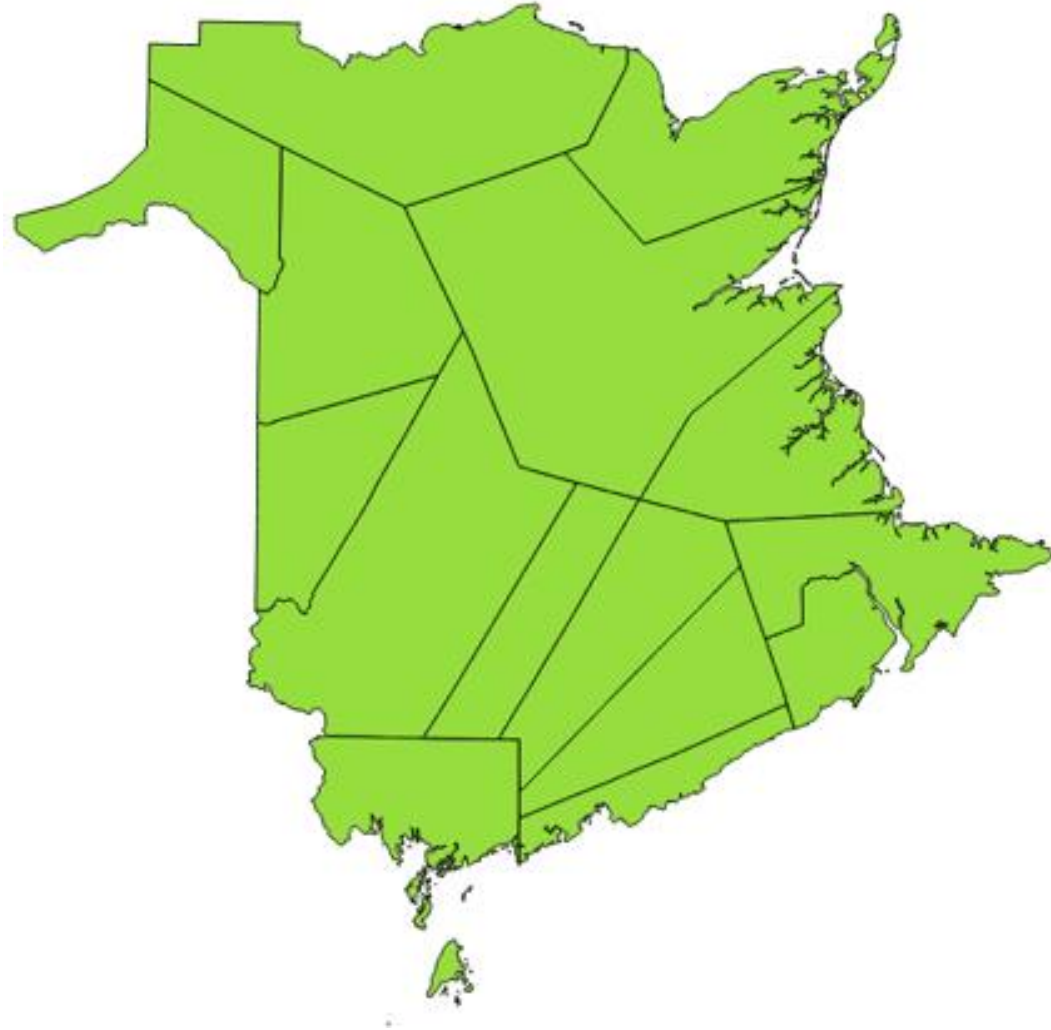
New Brunswick Cities (2016, Immigrants [Recent immigrants] %)



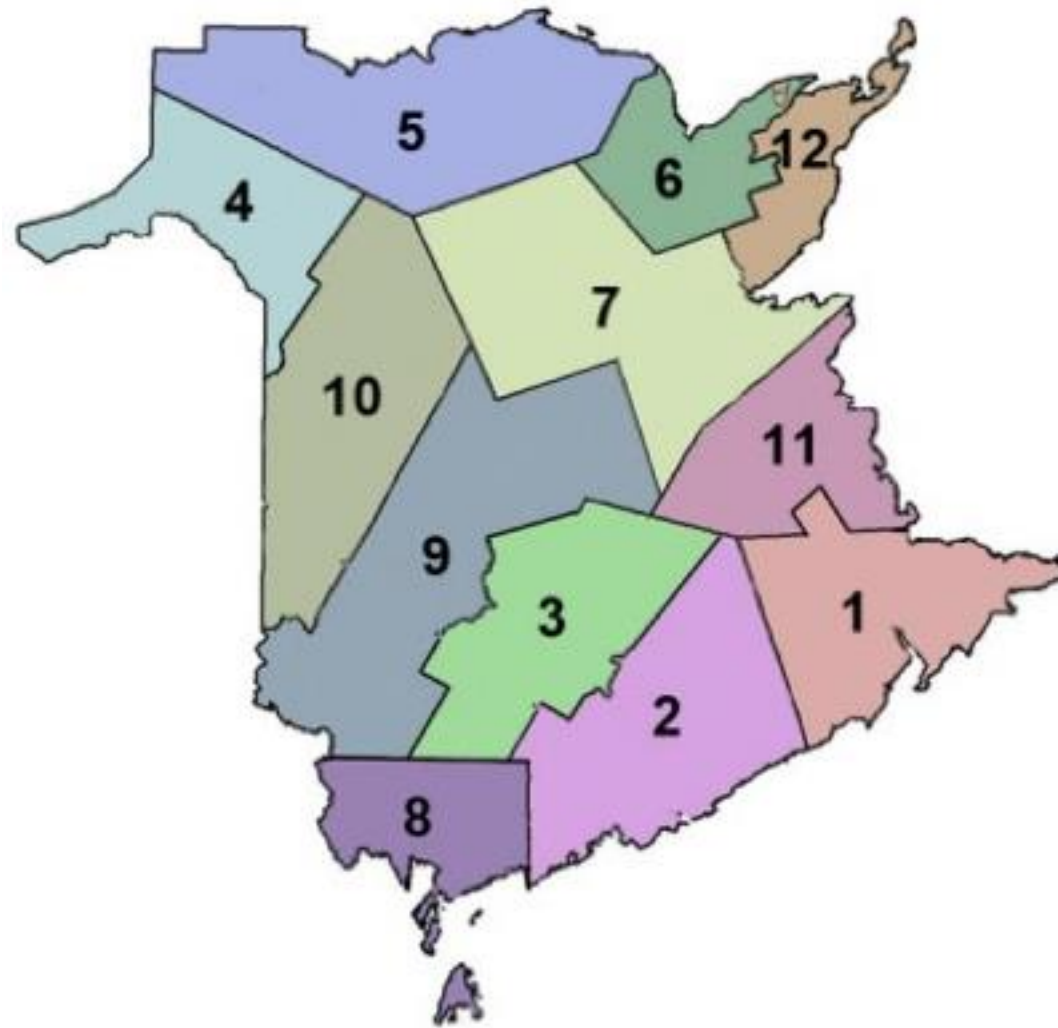
New Brunswick Cities (2016, Visible Minorities [%])



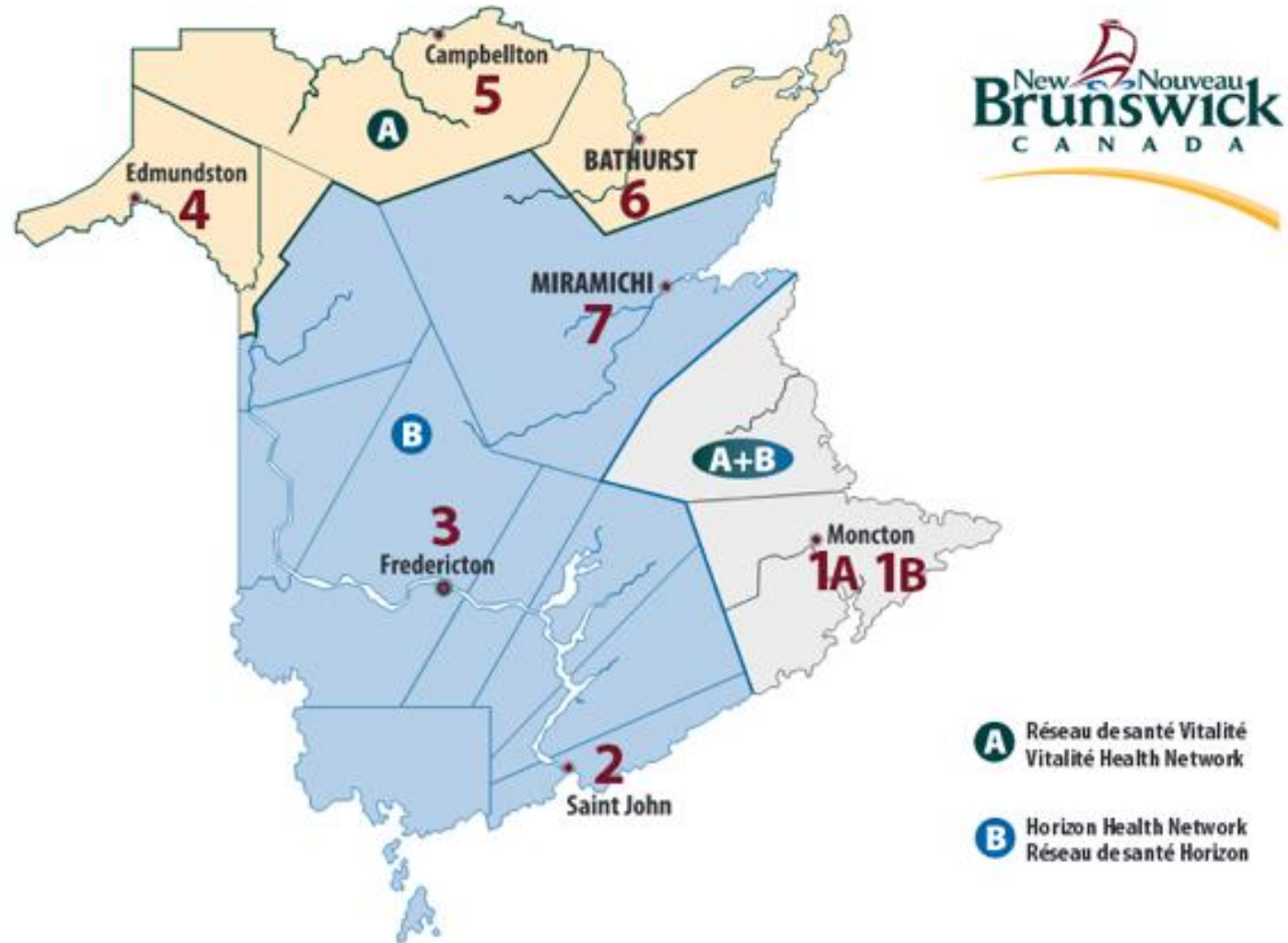

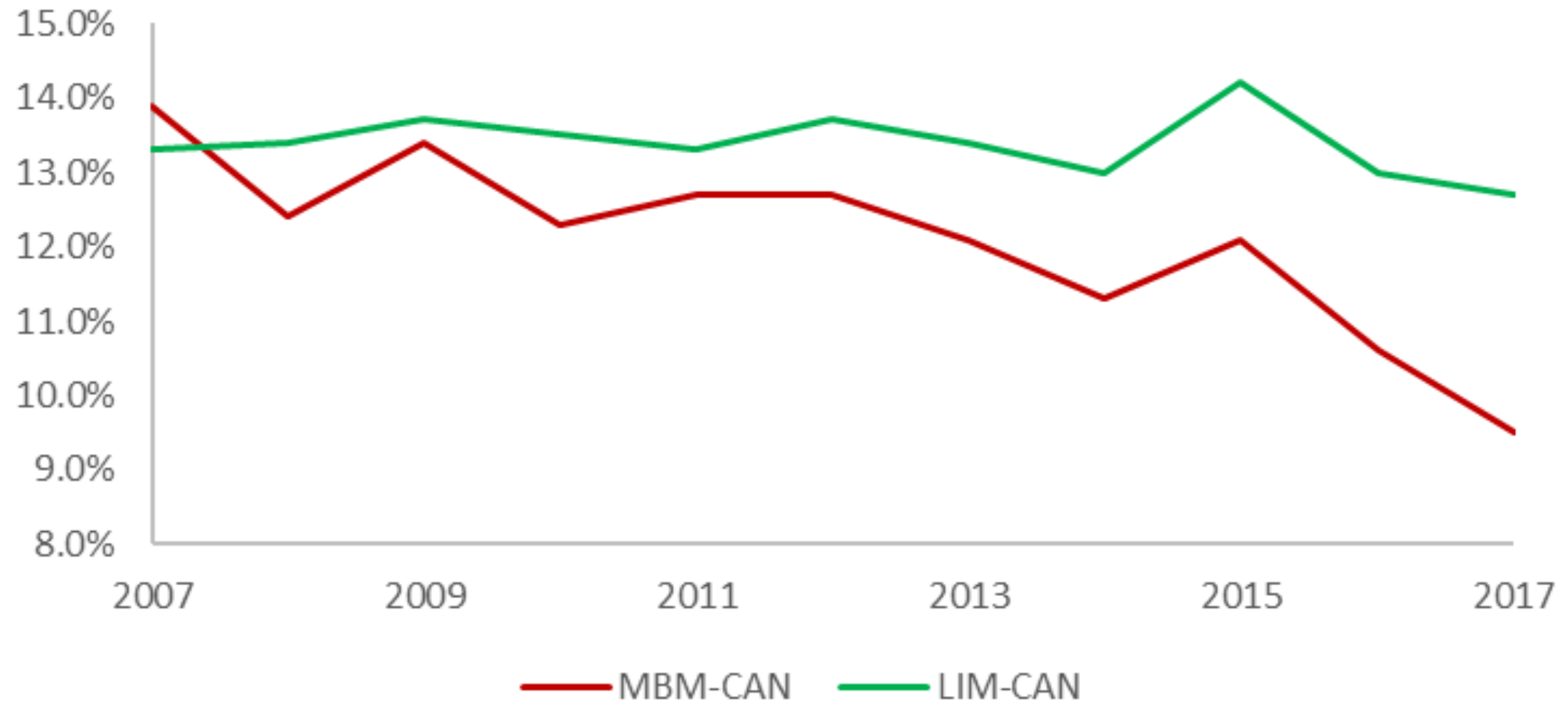

The condition of a person who lacks the **resources, means, opportunities, and power** necessary to acquire and maintain economic self-sufficiency or to integrate into and participate in society.

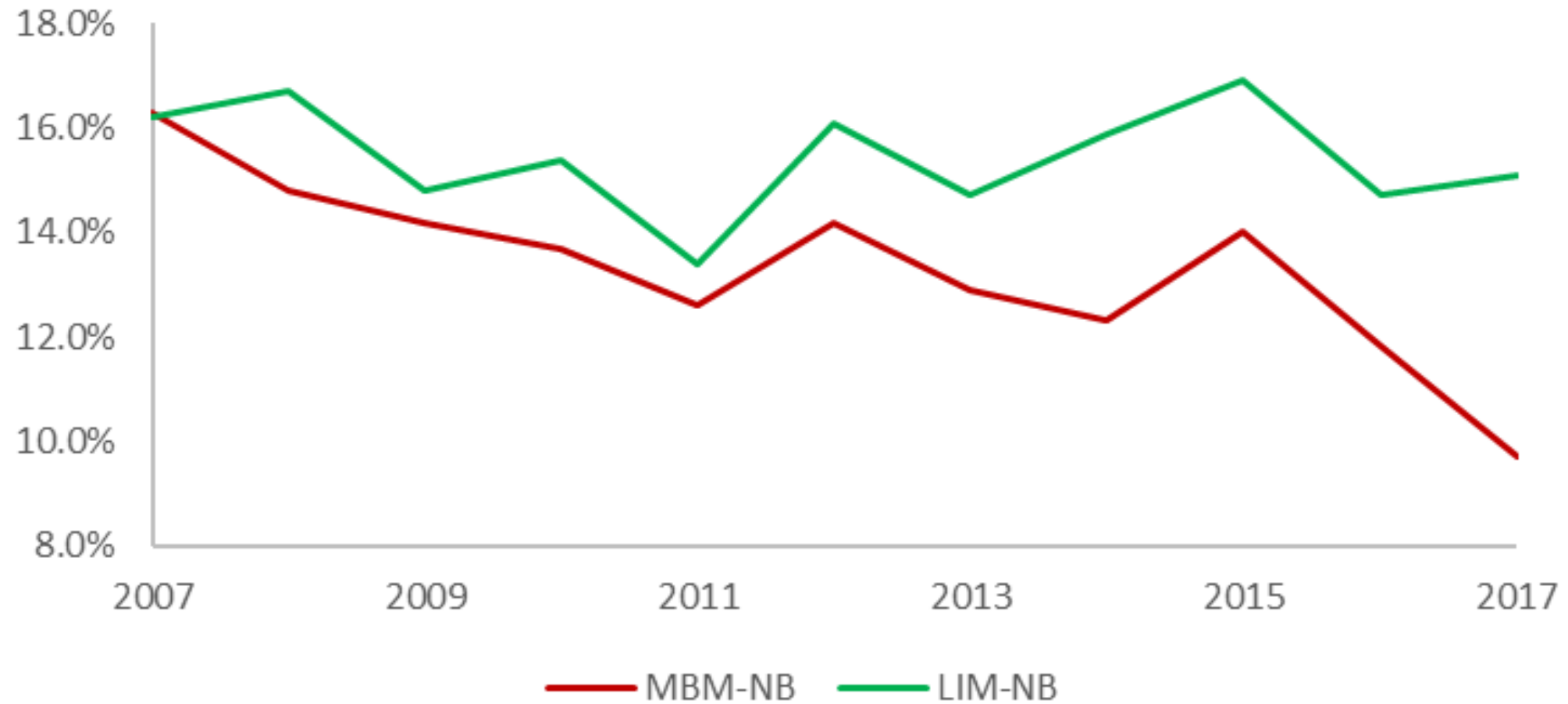


Measuring Poverty in Canada, from 2007 to 2017, MBM vs LIM



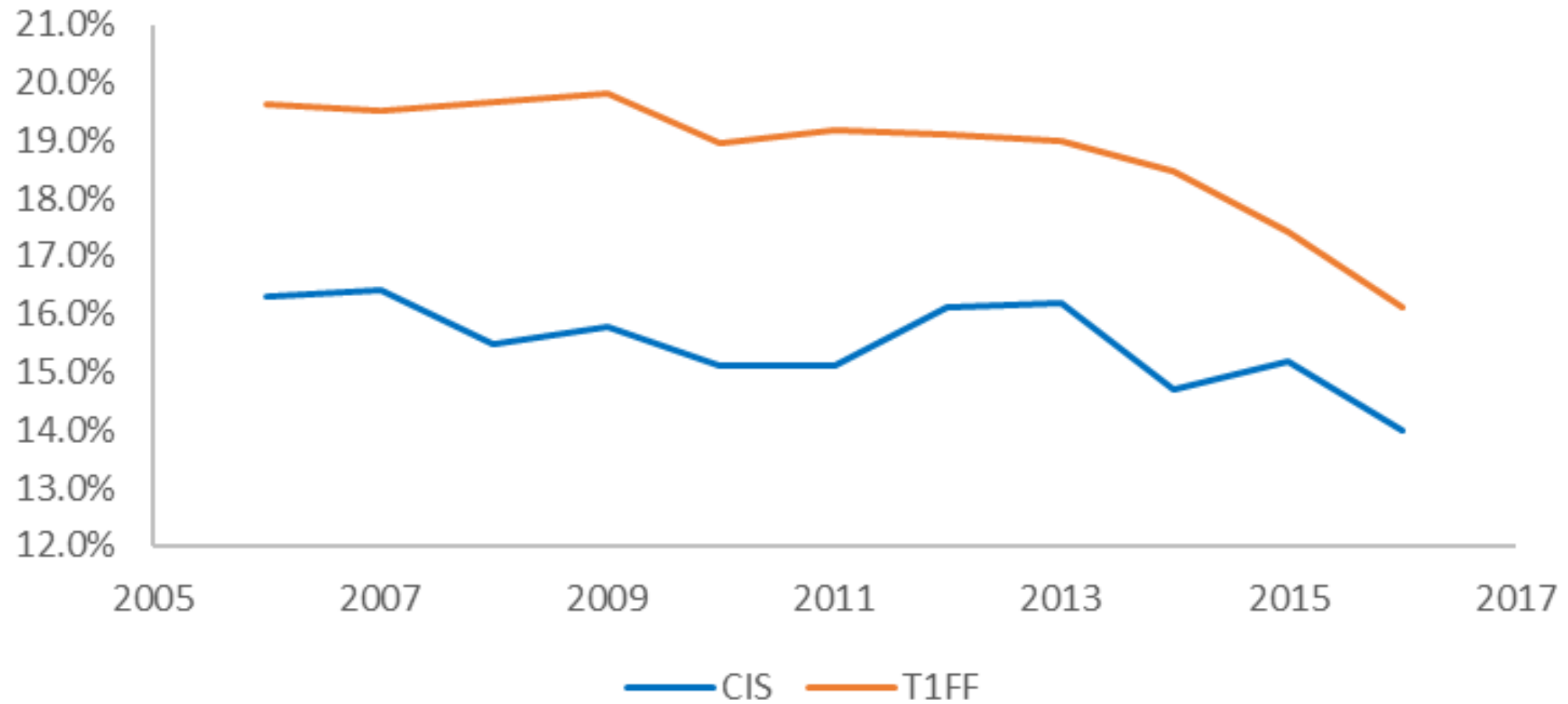

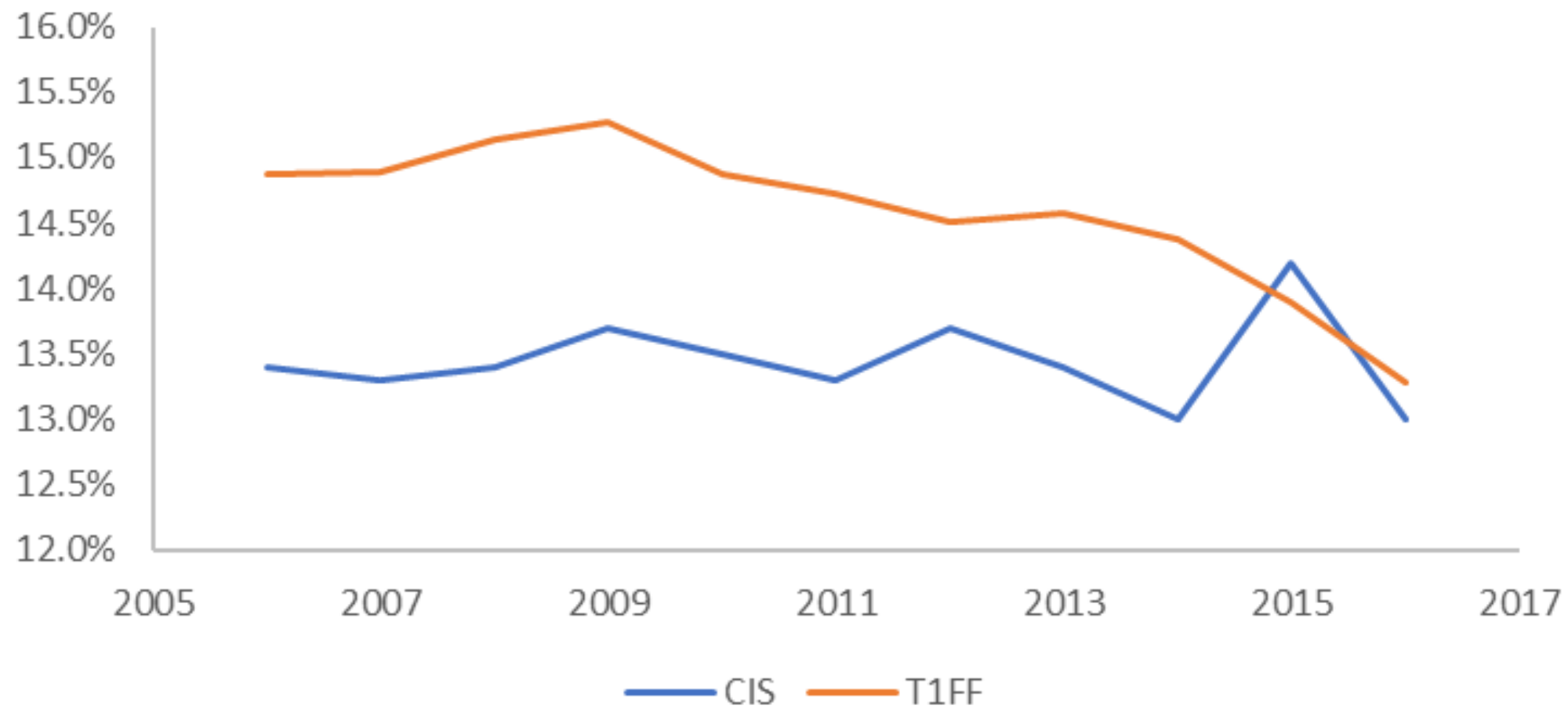
Children in Low-Income Families in Canada, from 2006 to 2016, T1FF vs CIS, LIM AT

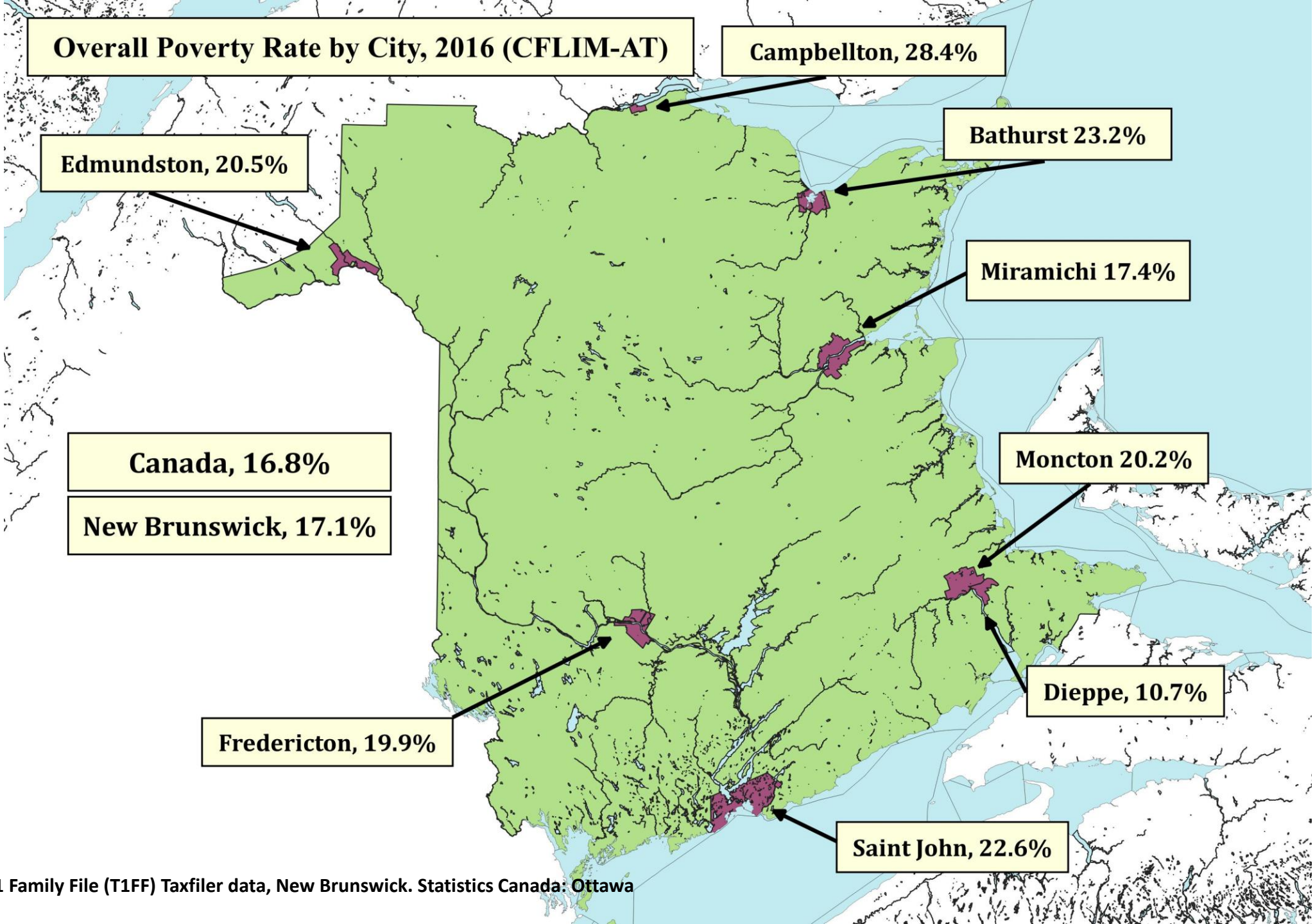

Low-Income Families in Canada, from 2006 to 2016, T1FF vs CIS, LIM AT



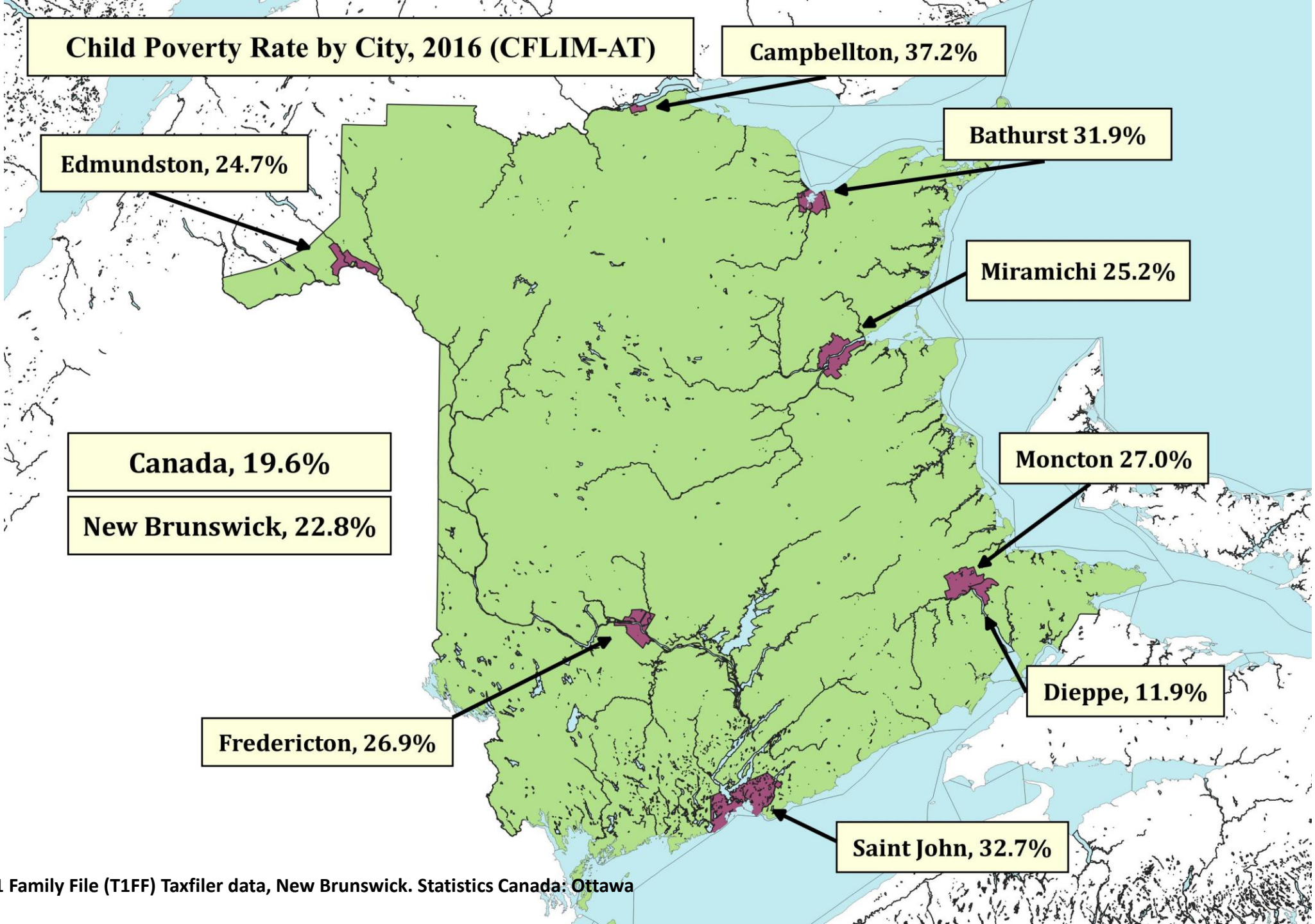

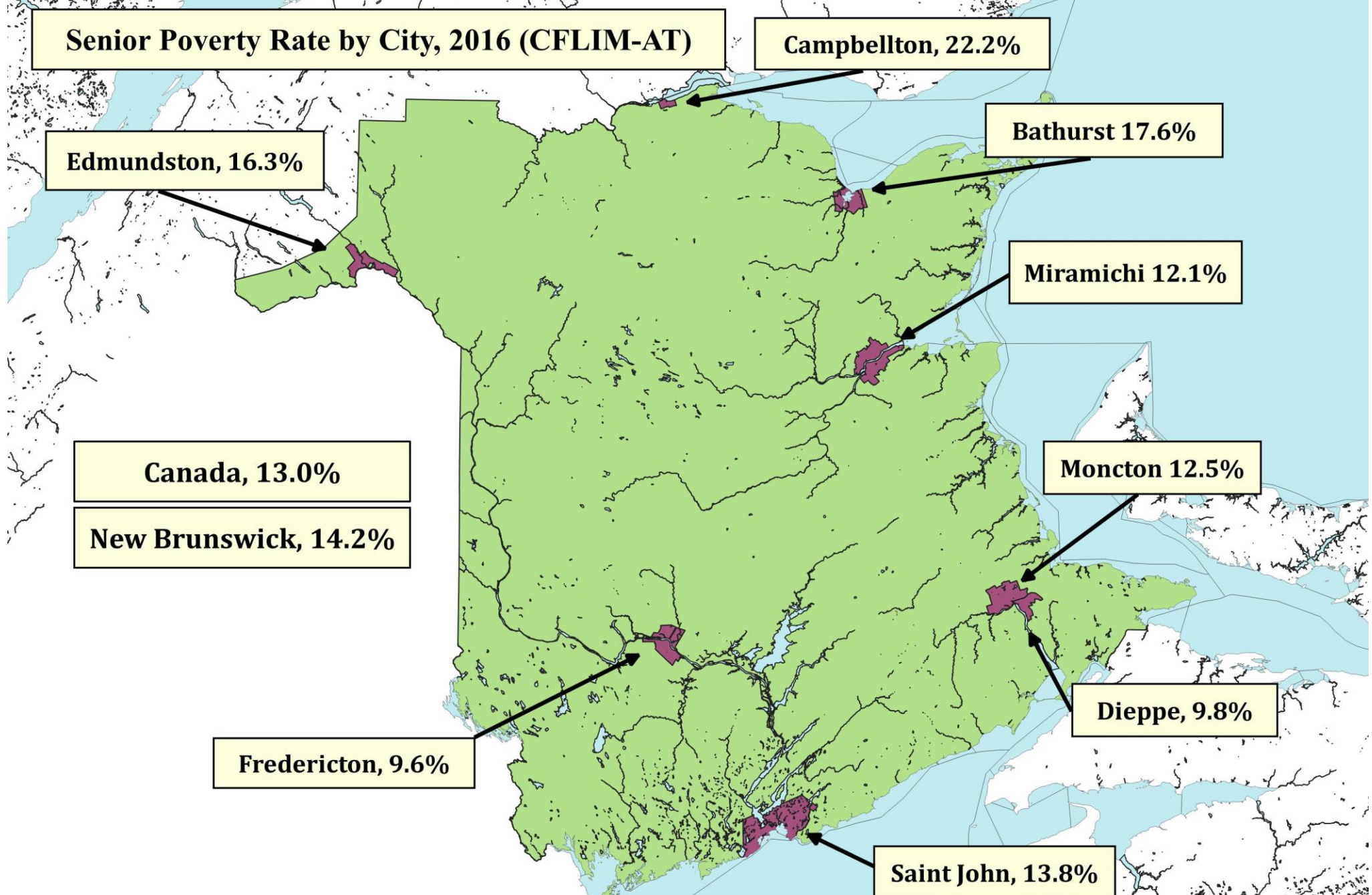

The Point-in-Time (PiT) Count is a strategy to help determine the extent of homelessness in a community at a single point in time. PiT counts allow a community to better understand the nature of homelessness and the demographics of the homeless population. Conducting a PiT count is a first step in creating future measures towards reducing homelessness. This project was funded in part by the Government of Canada's Homelessness Partnering Strategy. The count occurred in Bathurst, Fredericton, Moncton, and Saint John.

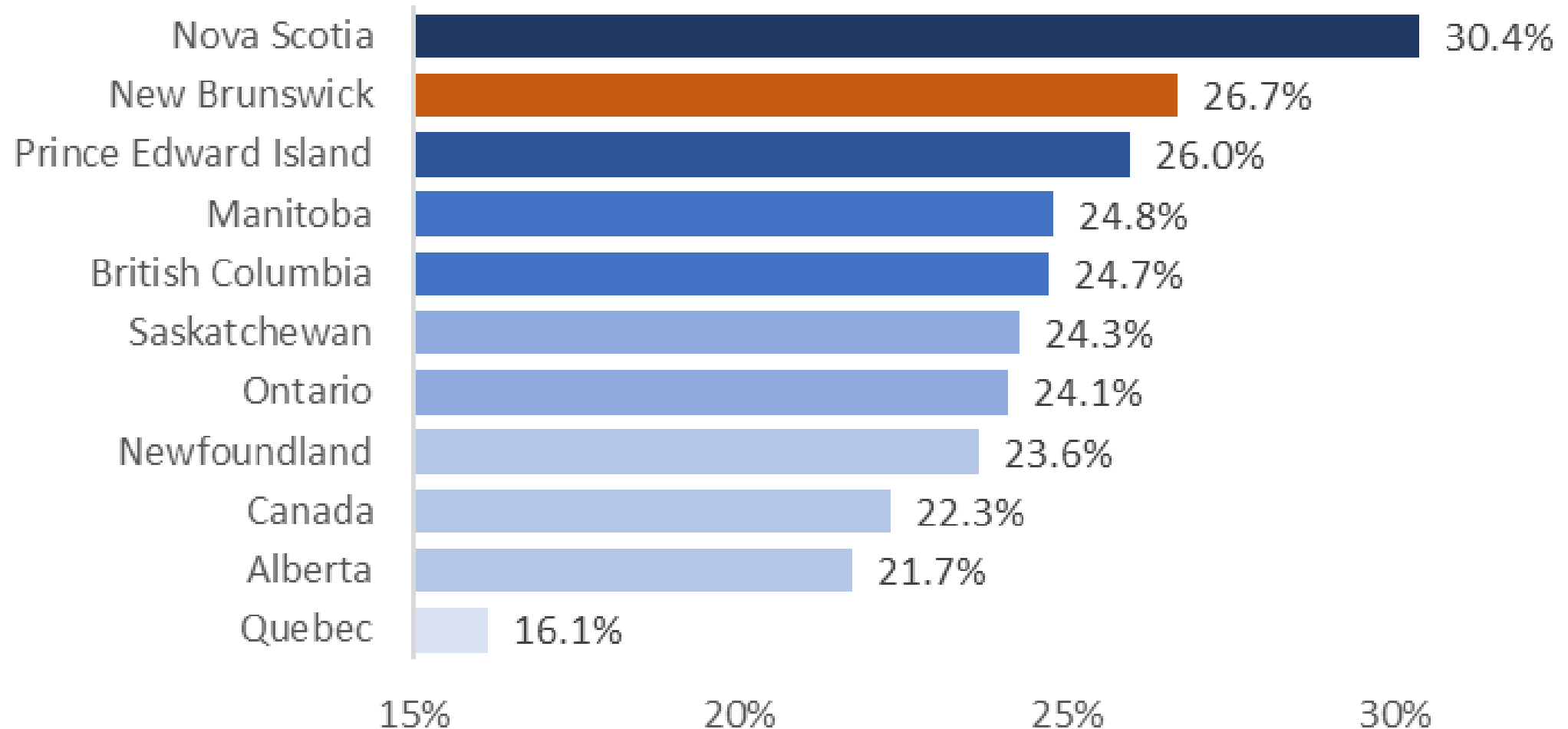

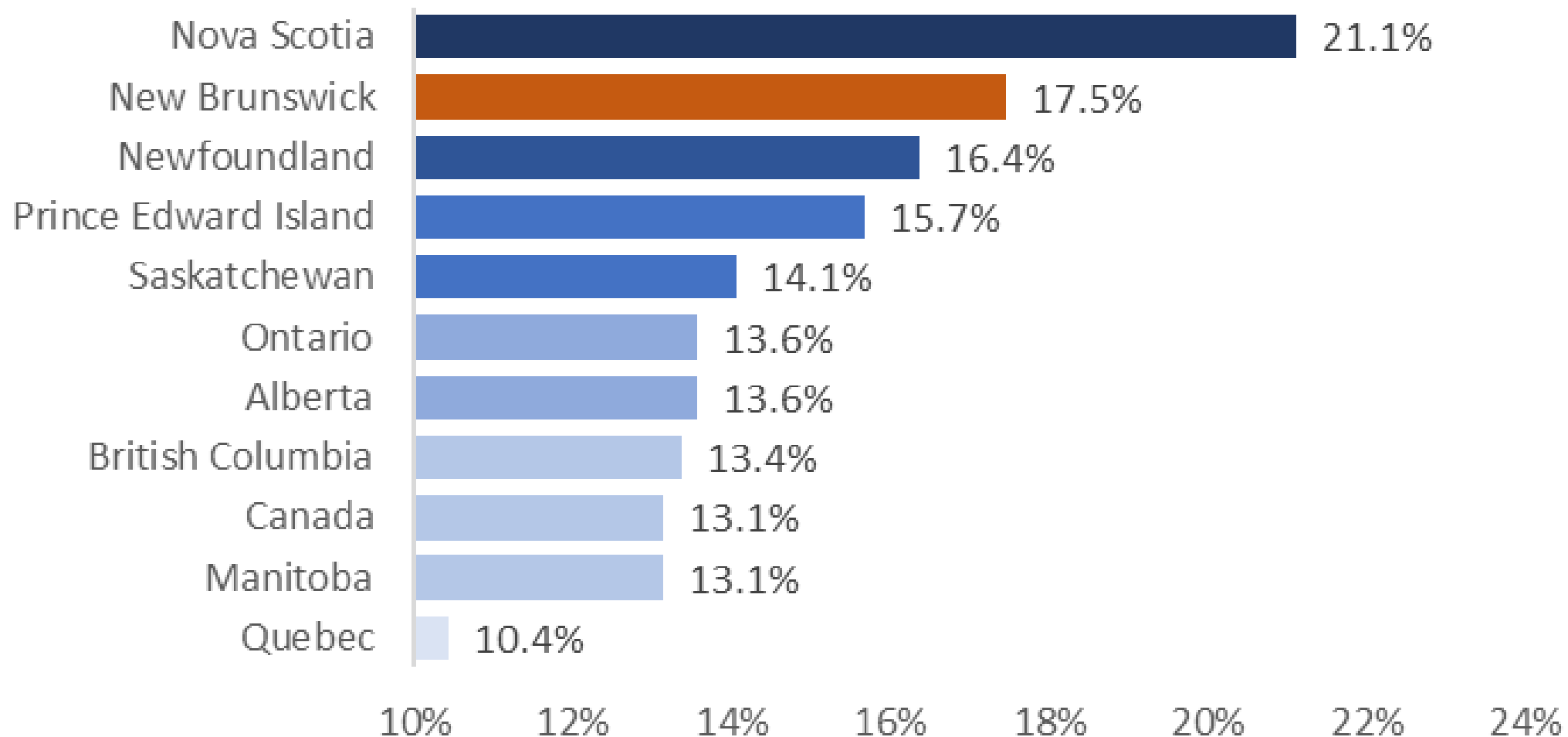

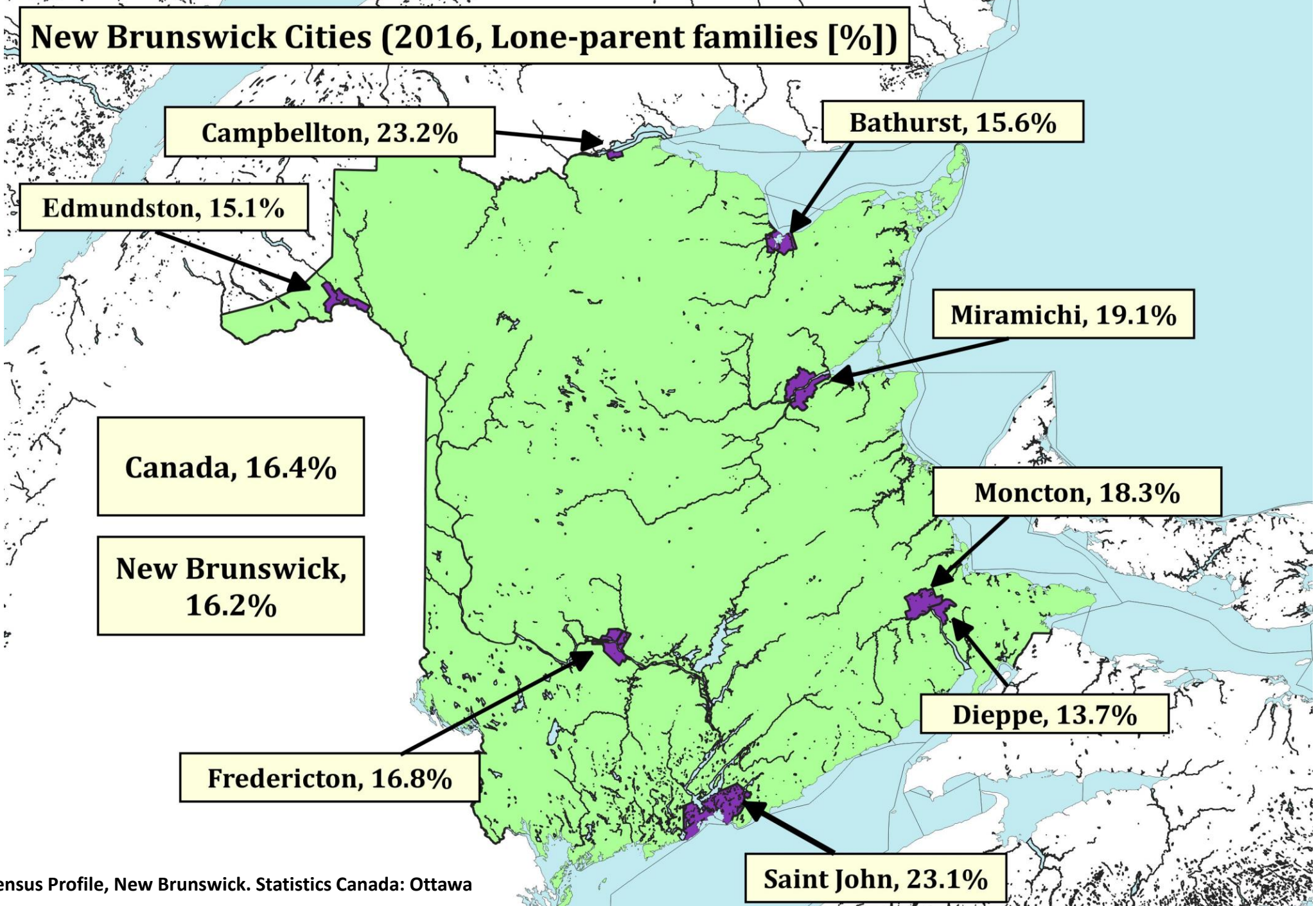
Percentage of Population Aged 15 and Over with Disabilities, 2017



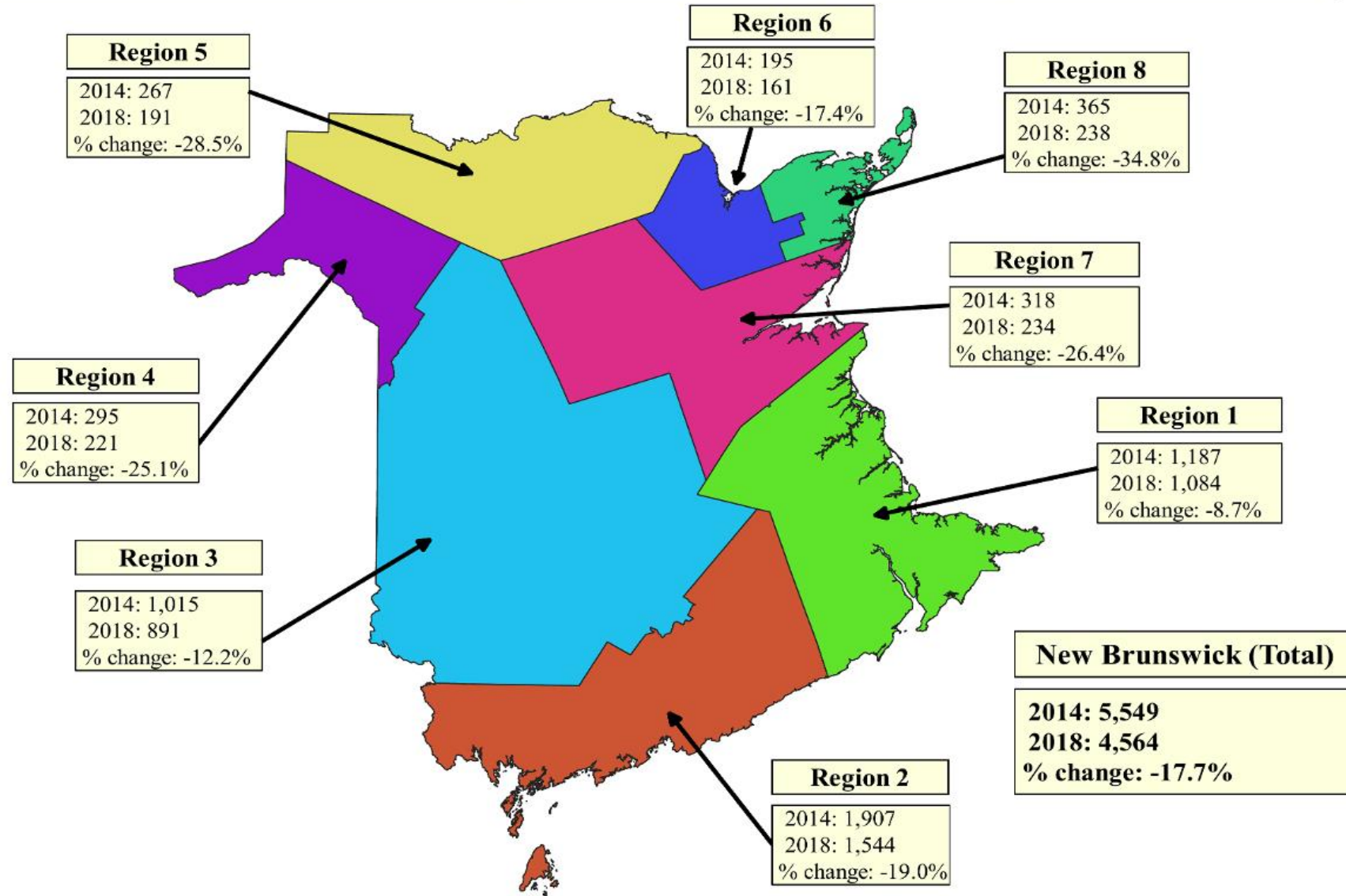
Percentage of Population Aged 15 to 24 with Disabilities, 2017

Social Assistance Case Loads, Regional Changes from 2014 - 2018

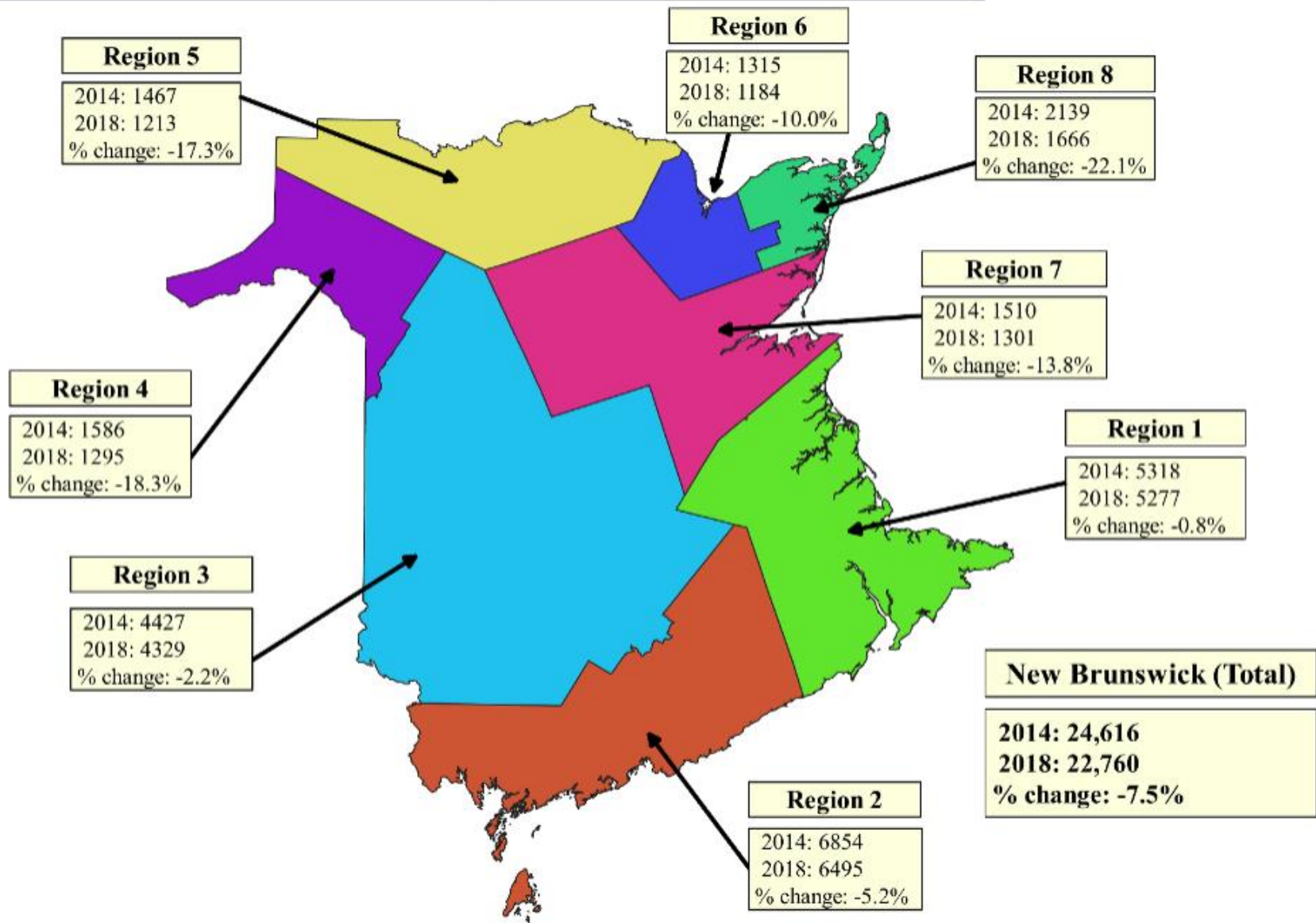
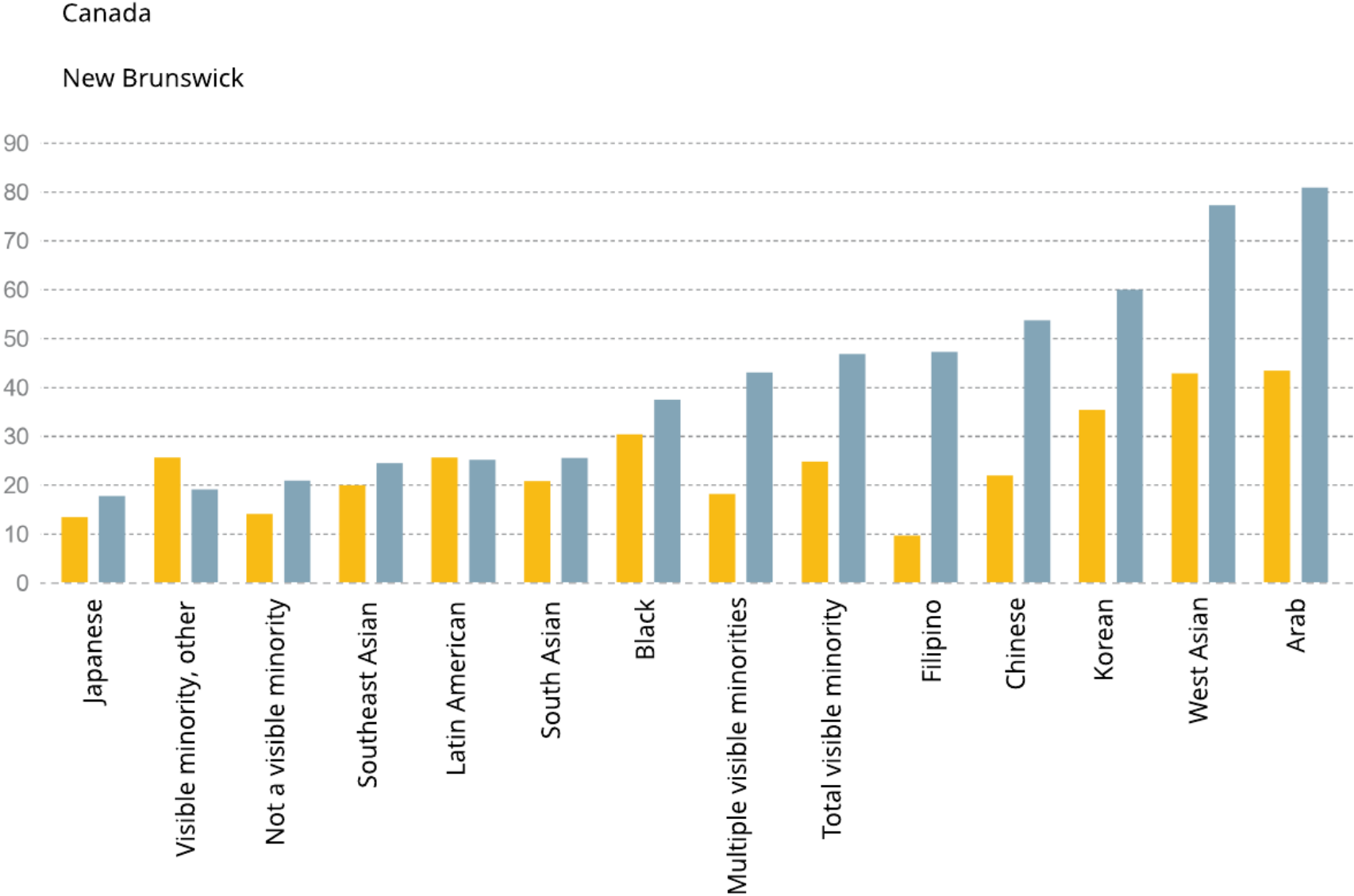
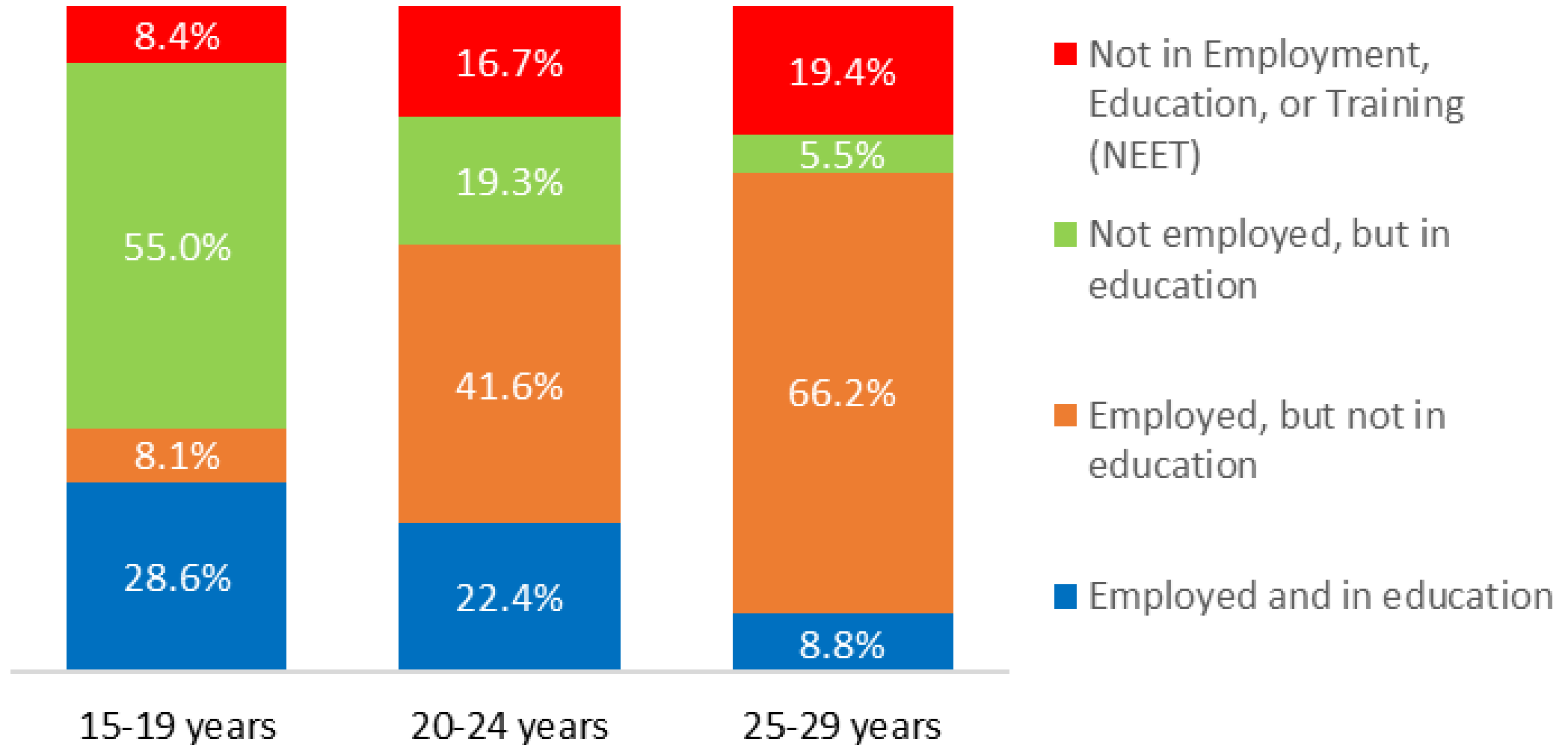


Chart 4: Child Poverty Rate by Visible Minority Status, Canada, New Brunswick, 2016

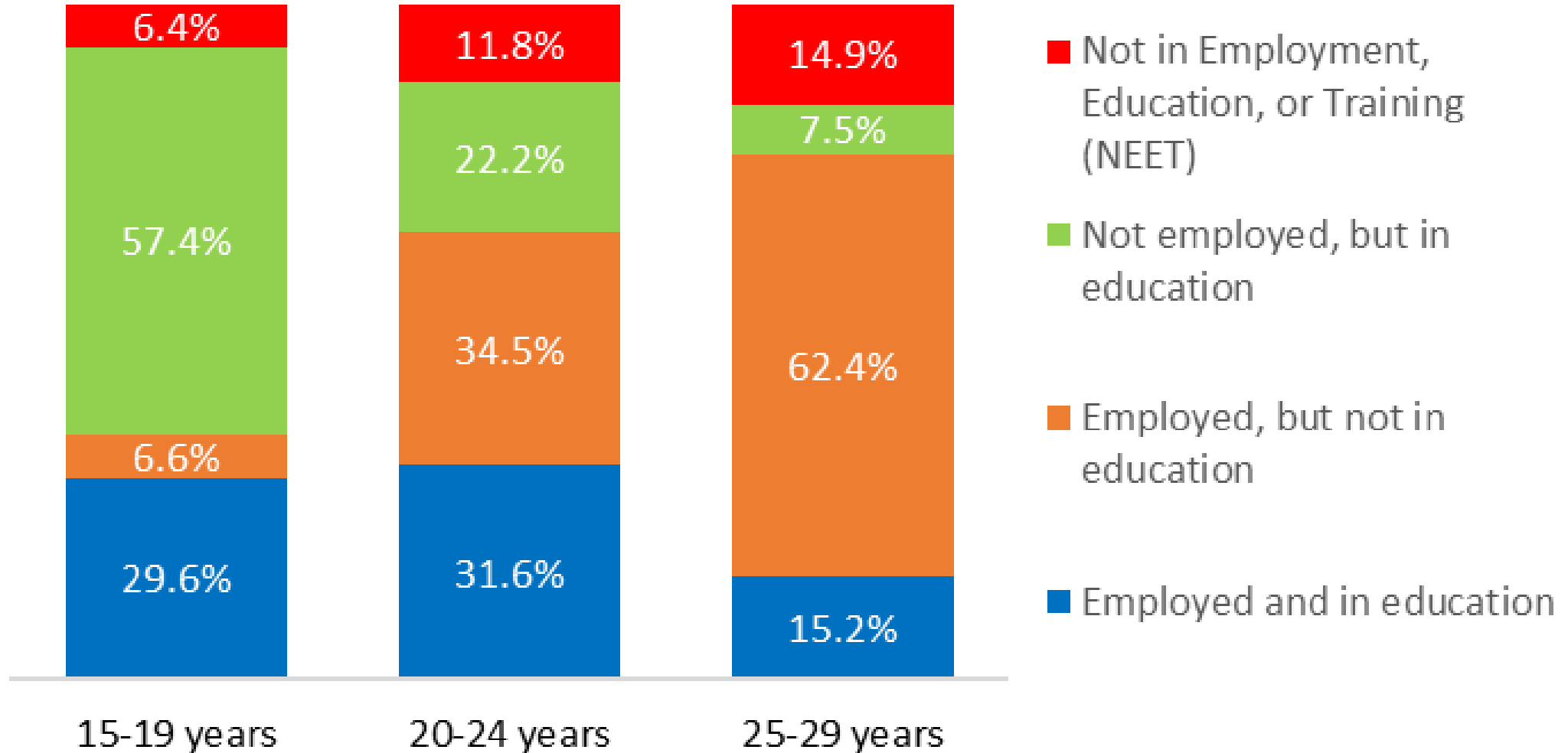

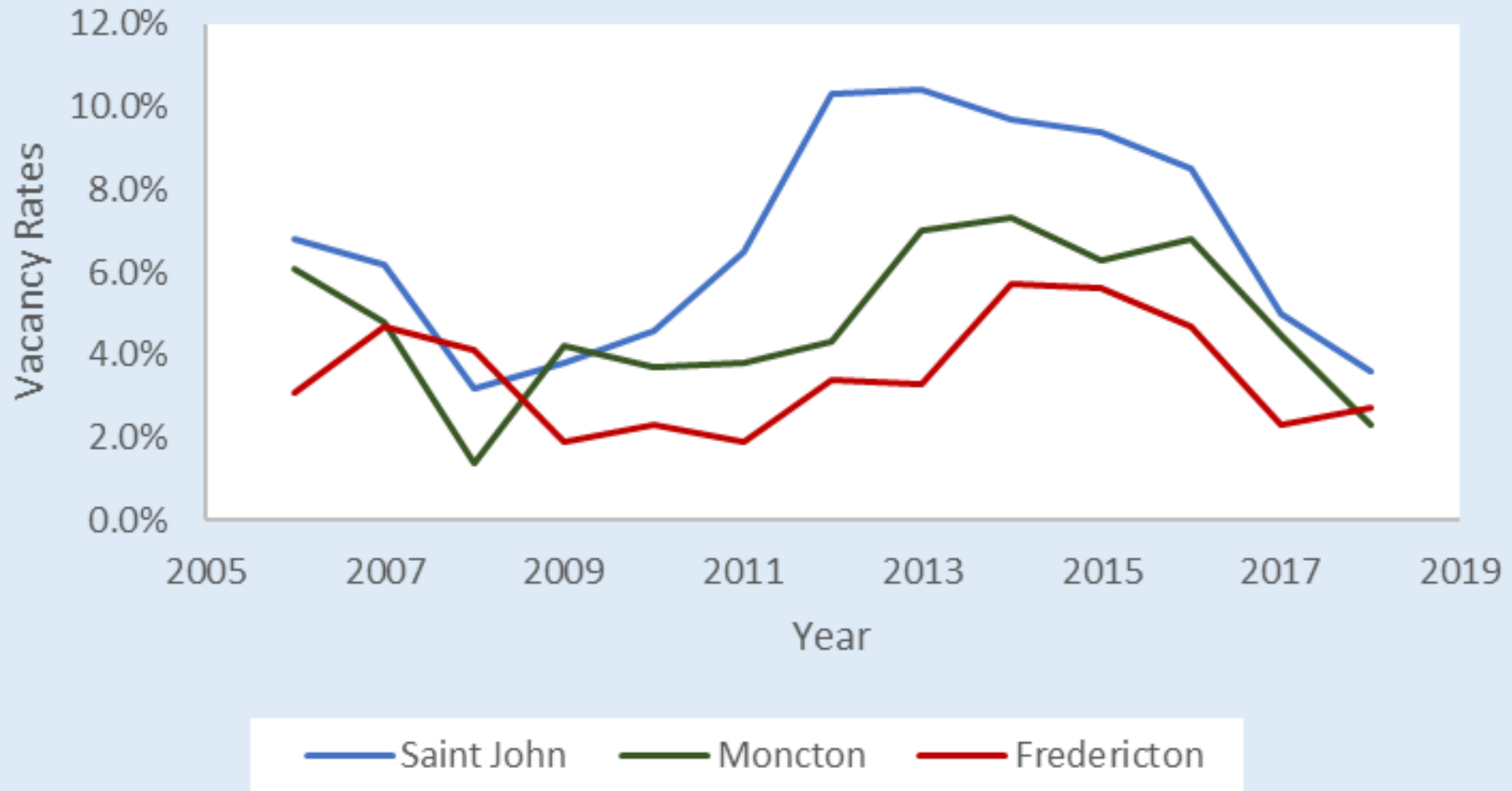
Percentage of Population by Employment and Education Status and Age, New Brunswick, 2016



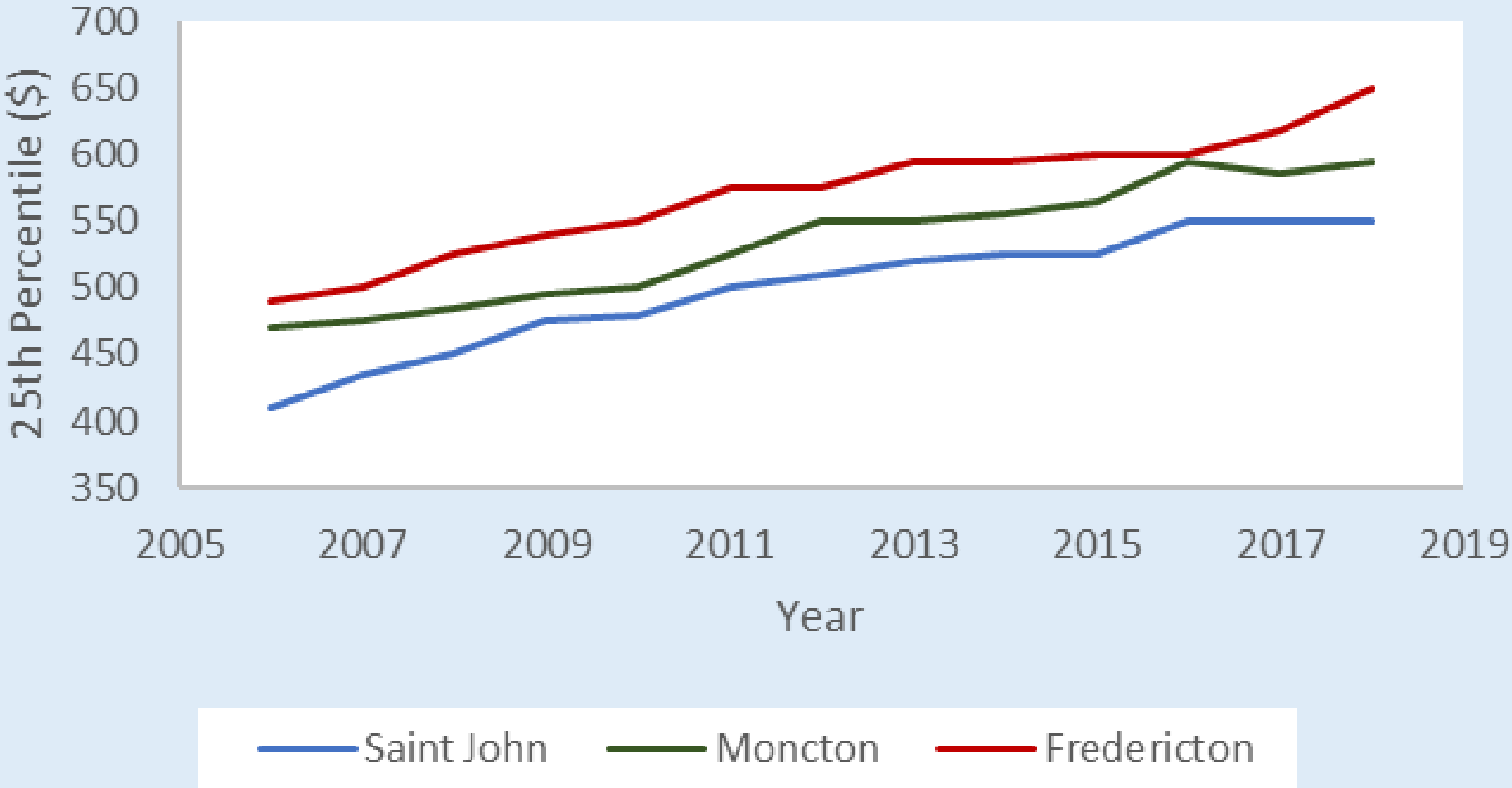
Percentage of Population by Employment and Education Status and Age, Canada, 2016



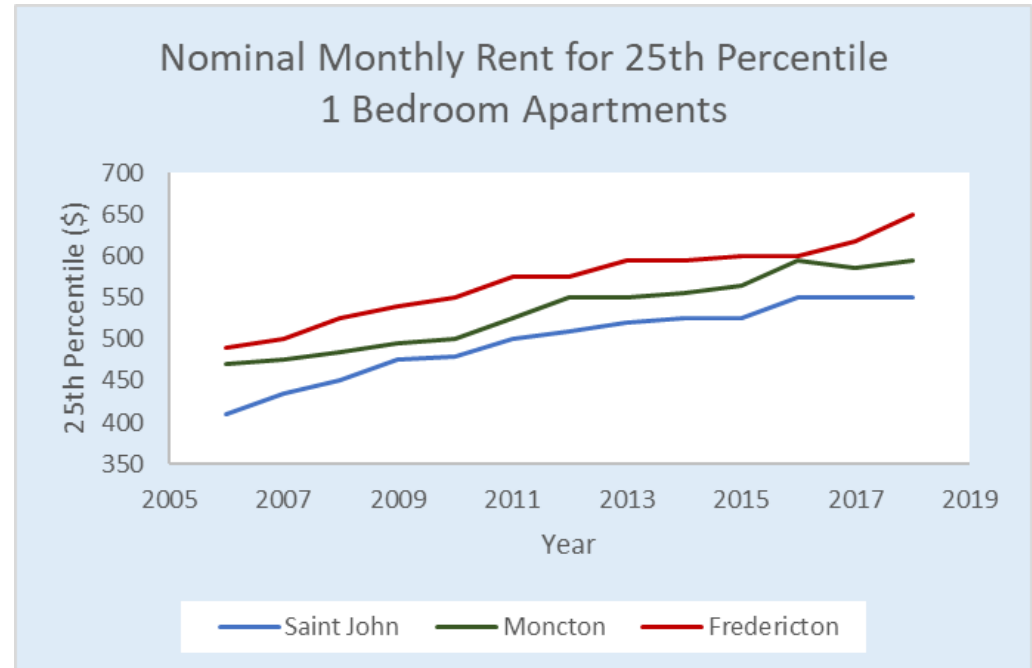
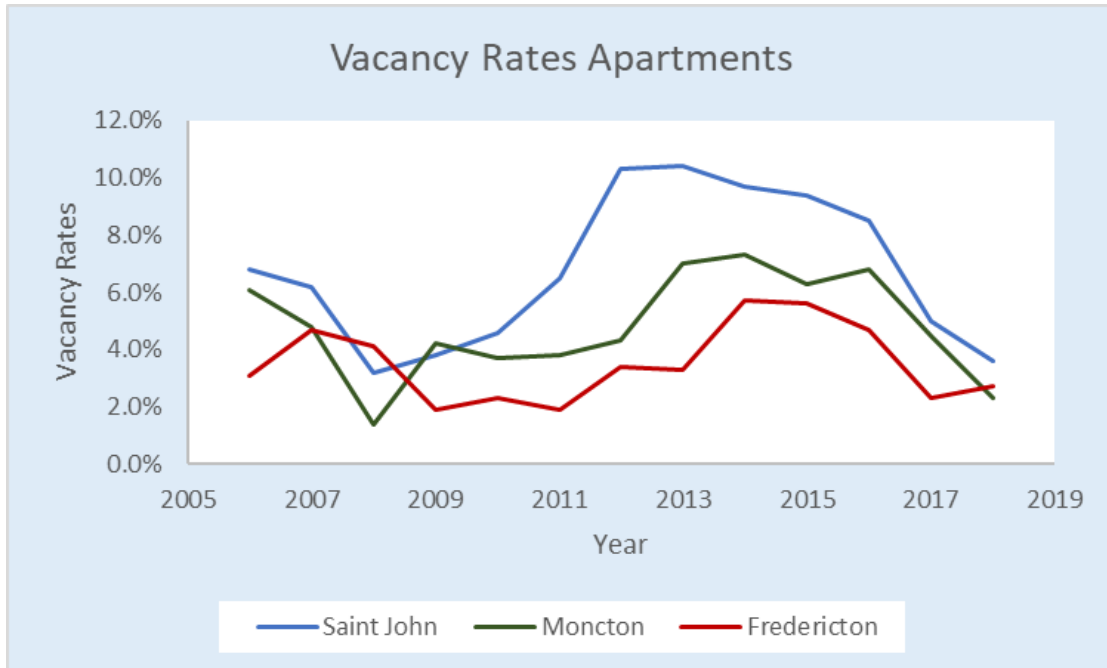
Vacancy Rates Apartments



Nominal Monthly Rent for 25th Percentile 1 Bedroom Apartments

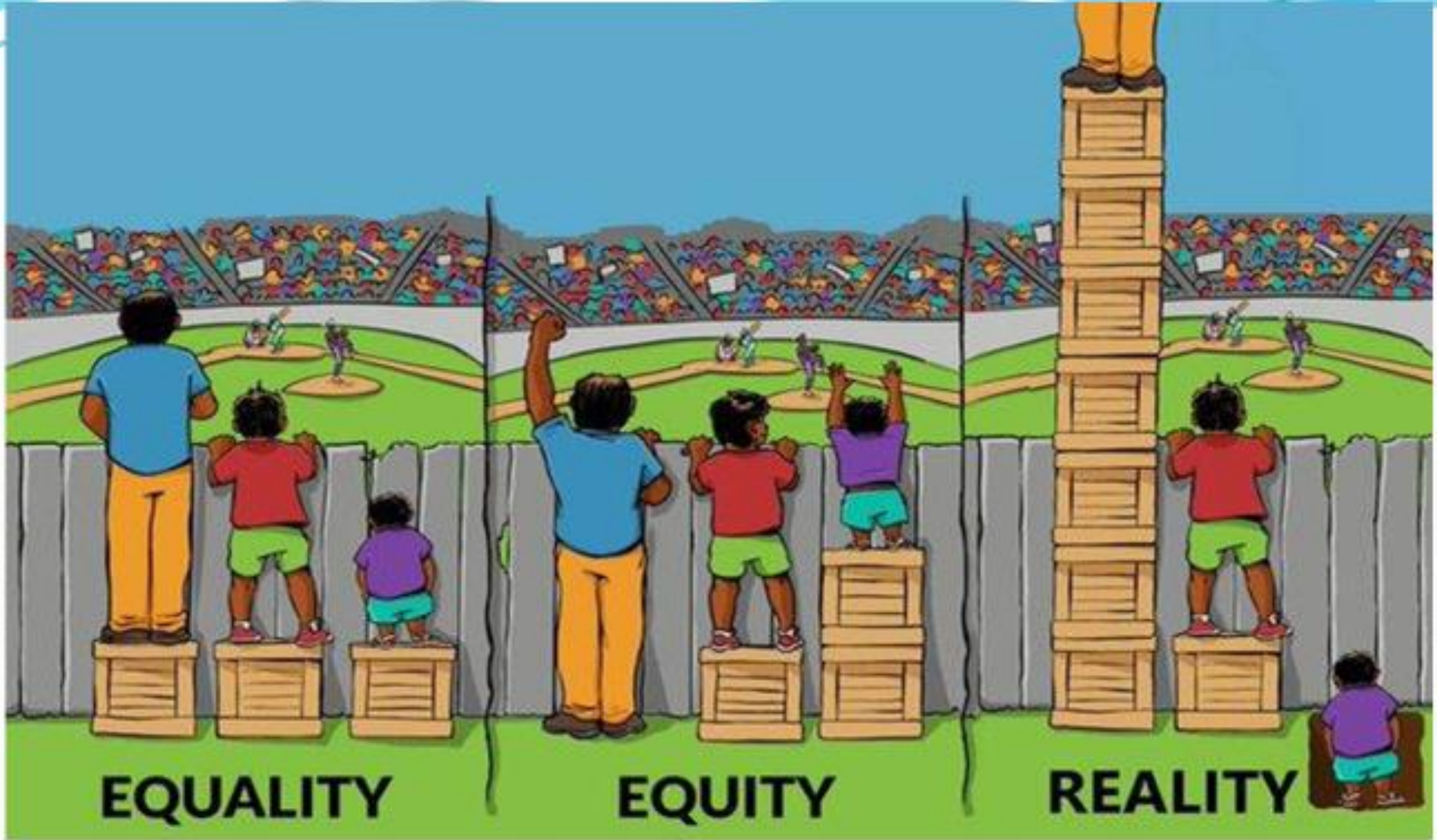

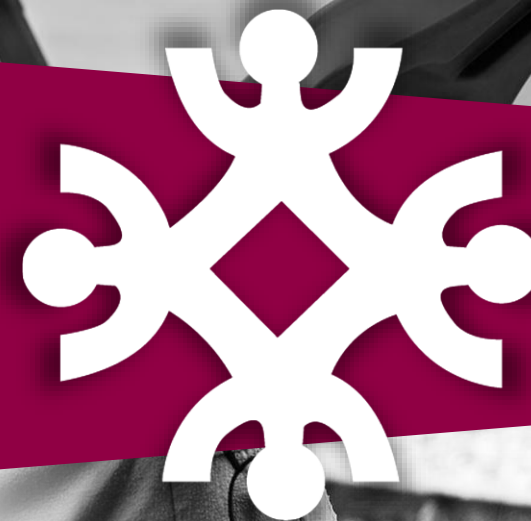
