

GASPEREAU WETLAND



QUICK FACTS

- Protects the habitat of species-at-risk like Olive-sided Flycatcher, Canada Warbler, Eastern Wood Pewee, and Wood Thrush.
- 4,760 ha of the area includes floodplains, riparian wetlands and the Gaspereau River, which enhance freshwater ecosystem function and health.
- 2,420 ha of Old Forests including Black Spruce, White Pine, and Eastern White Cedar.
- Fills gaps in the representation of the Bantalor Ecodistrict (learn more here) within New Brunswick's protected areas network and enhances existing Protected Natural Areas like the Gaspereau PNA.

Why is this area under consideration?

This new proposed area would add 7,330 ha of headwater wetlands where the Miramichi River and Wolastoq/St. John River Watersheds meet in central NB.
