GREEN RIVER





The Green River proposed site would protect 640 hectares (ha) in Madawaska County. The River, named for its green waters, flows into the upper reaches of the Wolastoq/St. John River.

QUICK FACTS

- 350 ha of the area includes floodplains, riparian habitats and the river itself, which enhance freshwater ecosystem function and health
- Almost entirely old forest, with species such as Yellow Birch and Sugar Maple.
- This area also captures the habitat for the at risk Canada Warbler and Eastern Wood-Pewee.
- Steep riverbank slopes and rich soil allow for many plant species to grow and thrive including Squashberry and Dutchmen's Breeches.
