

# SOUTH CHARLO RIVER

## Why is this area under consideration?

The South Charlo River is recognized for its importance for the conservation of New Brunswick's rare flora species. This candidate covers 1,150 ha of added protections to the Town of Dalhousie's drinking water supply.

## QUICK FACTS

- 940 ha is comprised of old forest, including American Beech, Sugar Maple, and Balsam Fir and provides habitat for the at-risk and culturally significant Black Ash.
- 380 ha of the area is made up of the flood zone and steep slopes which contribute to the health of the South Charlo River and its surrounding tributaries.
- Ledges in the steep slopes provide the ideal location for rare plant species to thrive such as New England Violet, Alpine Cliff Fern, and Northern Bent Grass.
